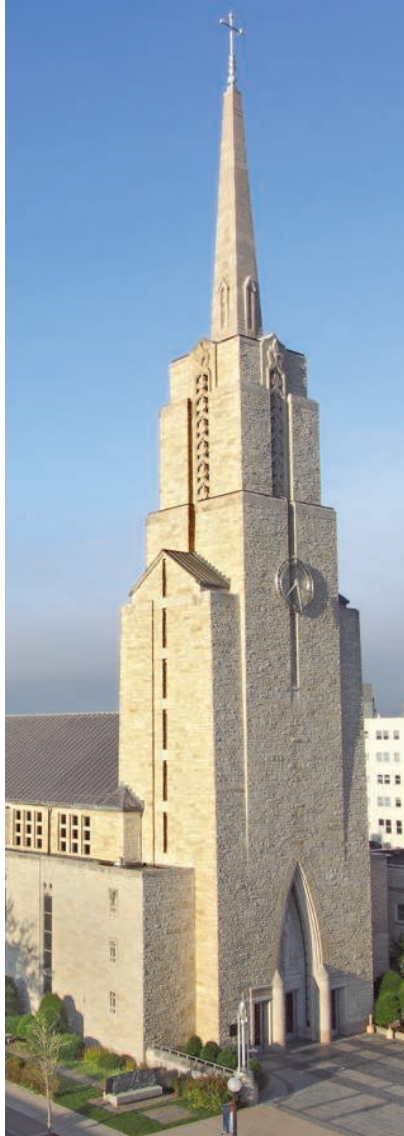

HOLY WEEK CELEBRATIONS

Please note carefully and participate in the various celebrations throughout this Holy Week.

To Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: There is a sign-up sheet in the sacristy requesting your assistance for Easter Sunday. Please sign up as soon as possible.

OLD PALMS

There is a box for you to put in last year's palms. They should be disposed of properly and not thrown in the trash. The box is located in the main hallway leading to the Sacristy, and will remain there until the end of April.

ALL DAY CONFESSIONS

Monday of Holy Week (March 26) the Cathedral will have all day confessions from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm. Please note that the weekday 12:10 pm Mass on Monday will be celebrated in the Marian Chapel.

GOOD FRIDAY MEAL REGULATIONS

As Msgr. Stoetzel indicated in his column this week, the Lenten Season concludes right before the celebration of Mass on Holy Thursday. Good Friday regulations are as follows:

Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Good Friday. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

LENTEN SOUP SUPPERS

ORCHESTRA PRELUDE AT 10:10 AM

The prelude to the 10:30 Mass on Easter Sunday will be the Concerto in C minor for Oboe and Violin by J. S. Bach. The featured soloists are Wes Luke, Concertmaster of the La Crosse Symphony Orchestra and Mary Beth Hensel, Principal Oboist with the La Crosse Symphony Orchestra, performing together with our own Easter chamber orchestra. They will be performing this piece again at the regular June La Crosse Symphony Orchestra concert. The piece will begin at approximately 10:10 am on Easter Sunday, so you will want to arrive early!

HIGH WINDS

To parishioners and visitors: due to occasional high winds, there will be times in which three of the four doors will be locked leading into the Narthex just off of the Main Street Plaza. This is done to prevent damage to the doors swinging in the wind and to conserve heat and cooling. We will do our best to put a sign on the door that may be used for entering the Cathedral Church.

Weekly Message From **THE HOLY SEE** **POPE FRANCIS**



Jesus' action was interpreted as *an action typical of prophets*, who often denounced, in the name of God, abuses and excesses. The issue raised was that of authority. In fact the Jews asked Jesus: "What sign have you to show us for doing this?" (John v. 18), that is, what authority do you have to do these things? As if to demand that he show he was truly acting in the name of God.

To interpret Jesus' act of purifying the house of God, His disciples made use of a biblical text taken from Psalm 69 [68]: "For zeal for thy house has consumed me" (v. 9). This Psalm is a call for help in a situation of extreme peril due to the hatred of enemies: the situation that Jesus will experience in His Passion.

Zeal for the Father and for his house will lead Him all the way to the Cross: His is the zeal of love which leads to self-sacrifice, not that false zeal that presumes to serve God through violence.

AED IN THE GATHERING AREA

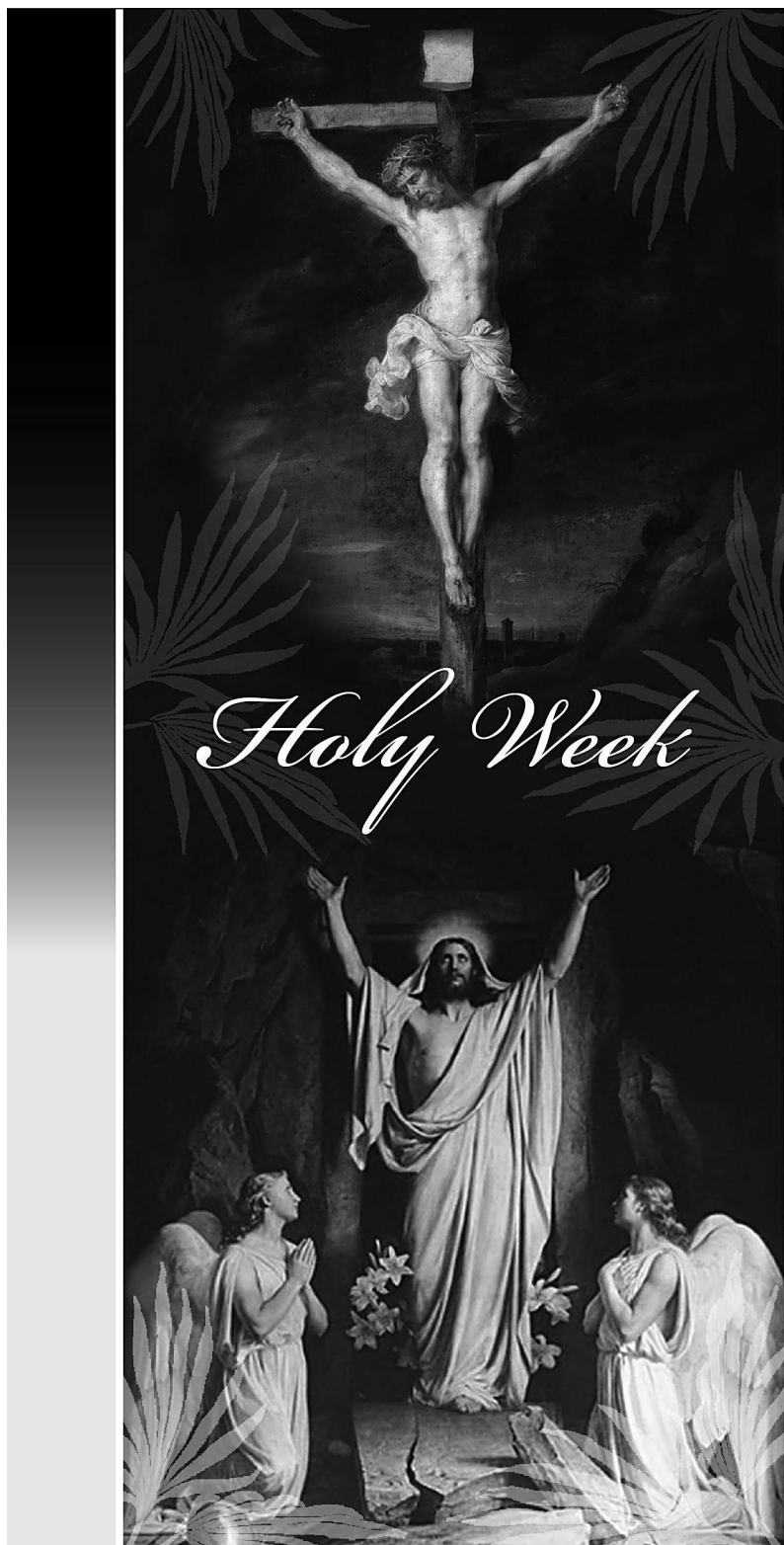
In the event of a medical emergency, the Cathedral Church has an AED (automated external defibrillator) which is located along the wall of the north door exit of the Gathering Area.
