# **RIDING THE RAILS OF LIFE**



Dear parishioners and visitors,

The 2018 Diocesan Annual Appeal begins this weekend at the Cathedral Parish. Over the years, you have been very generous so much so that any money given that exceeds the target amount has been returned to the parish. That money was used to help support the operational budget of the parish.

Last year, the target amount for our parish was \$48,000 which we exceeded it by at least \$6,000. The target this year is \$46,225 or \$1,775 less than last. If everyone who gave last year would give at least that much again, we should have no problem exceeding the target again. I have already made my contribution which I increased it a bit more. Remember the old saying: 10% is to go back to God. If you tithe 5% of your income to the parish to support it, perhaps 2-3% percent should go to this appeal.

## KNIGHTS OF ST. JOSEPH

During the month of September, there are four intertwined feasts in which the Knights of St. Joseph will pray and reflect upon. The first of these feasts is the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, where through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed, meaning, Mary being born without the stain of Original Sin.

We then venerate our Blessed Mother on the Feast of the Holy Name of Mary, who opens our stony hearts to God's perfect will. Two days later, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross where legend has it that when the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher was being built, a cross on which our Lord was crucified was found by workers and later touched to a dying woman, who in turn, was healed as a result. The following day is the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, who's sorrows were a prediction spoken by Simeon at the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, who said a sword would pierce Our Lady's soul. The fulfillment of Simeon's prediction would be that of Our Lady at the foot of the cross as she gazed at and agonized over her Son's Crucifixion and yet, saw in His sacred wounds the salvation of the world.

## Weekly Message From **THE HOLY SEE** **POPE FRANCIS**



Each time we participate in the Holy Mass, in a certain sense, we anticipate heaven on earth, because from the Eucharistic sustenance, the Body and Blood of Jesus, we learn what eternal life is. It is living for the Lord: "he who eats me will live because of me" (v. 57), the Lord says. The Eucharist shapes us so that we live not only for ourselves but for the Lord and for our brothers and sisters. Life's happiness and eternity depend on our ability to render fruitful the evangelical love we receive in the Eucharist.

As in that time, today too Jesus repeats to each of us: "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you" (v. 53). Brothers and sisters, it is not about material sustenance, but a living and life-giving bread, which conveys the very life of God. When we receive Communion we receive the very life of God. To have this life it is necessary to nourish ourselves of the Gospel and of the love of our brothers and sisters.

## CROZIER DISPLAY

The information on the croziers displayed in the Gathering Area is as follows. A picture of a particular bishop's crozier can be found in the Diocesan 150th Celebration Book - *Feed My Lambs* - in the chapter dedicated to him along with his coat of arms, other of his artifacts, and the parishes that were established under his reign.

As one views the display in the gathering area the description begins to the left with the wooden crozier.

Wooden crozier: No known history, courtesy of Monsignor Robert Hundt

Bishop John J. Paul's crozier: used when he was the auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of La Crosse (1977-1983).

Raymond Cardinal Burke's: gifted back to the Diocese his miter with which he was installed as Bishop of La Crosse (1994-2003) and was also worn at his Episcopal Consecration by Pope Saint John Paul II. His crozier was given to him by the priests of the diocese on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of his priesthood ordination.

Bishop Alexander J. McGavick: miter and crozier (1921-1948).

The two croziers on either side of the monstrance were found in a cupboard when the first Cathedral was razed; no known history for either the croziers nor monstrance.

Bishop John P. Treacy's crozier: (1945-1964).

Bishop James Schwebach's crozier: (1891-1921).

Bishop William Patrick Callahan's crozier: on loan (2010-). When Bishop Callahan is the celebrant for a liturgy at the Cathedral, he uses Bishop Fredrick Freking's crozier (1965-1983).

Bishop John J. Paul's crozier: (1983-1994).

The embroidered miter belonged to Bishop Michael Heiss (1868-1880) which he brought from Germany. No known history.
