The "O Antiphons" OF ADVENT

The Roman Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since at least the eighth century. They are the antiphons that accompany the Magnificat canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.

KNIGHTS OF ST. JOSEPH

During the month of December, there is much for the Knights of St. Joseph to meditate upon and pray about, especially the Word becoming Incarnate in our midst. The first solemnity is that of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on December 8. December 12 is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. As we wind our way through the Advent Season straightening the paths that need straightening and jettisoning bad habits and behaviors, we finally reach the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord on December 25 in which the Angels rejoice. Following Christmas Day we celebrate the Feast of St. Stephen, the First Martyr. Then comes the Feast of St. John, the Apostle and Evangelist, immediately followed by the Feast of the Holy Innocents. On the 30th we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

As you can see the month of December is power packed with much to ponder about, meditate on, rejoice and weep over. The Saints, The Doctors of the Church, The Martyrs and The Evangelists have much wisdom and insight to impart to us. And where does this all lead us? Directly to our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of Kings, the Lord of Lord's and Prince of Princes.

The Knights of St. Joseph will gather for their Evening of Prayer on Friday, December 14, at 6:00 pm, at St. James the Less (1032 Caledonia Street). Our evening will consist of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, praying the Angelus, followed by Evening Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. Men will also have the opportunity to go to confession during our period of Eucharistic Adoration.

At 7:00 pm, Fr. Altman will give the men a talk on the Martyrs starting with St. Stephen, the very first Martyr up to our current time, which includes Blessed Miguel Pro and Brother James Miller and others, who conformed their wills to that of Our Lord and died and shed their blood for the Catholic Faith.

The evening will conclude with Night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours, and Benediction.

Men of all parishes are welcome to join the Knights of St. Joseph each second Friday of the month, September through May of each year. Even if you only have ten or fifteen minutes or a half hour to spare, come, spend time before the Blessed Sacrament.

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Baptism: Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. The baptism of infants at the Cathedral is ordinarily celebrated on Sundays at 12:00 noon. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Marriage: Couples who want to request the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector/pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the wedding. Weddings are not ordinarily celebrated during Lent.

Anointing of the Sick: Those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Visitation of the Sick:

If you become homebound because of illness and would like to be visited, please call the Cathedral parish office.
