**The History of  
'The Twelve Days of Christmas'**

The song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is an English Christmas carol. From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the Church.

**1** The "True Love" one hears in the song is Jesus Christ, because Love was born on Christmas Day. The partridge in the pear tree also represents Him because that bird is willing to sacrifice its life if necessary to protect its young by feigning injury to draw away predators.

According to Ann Ball in her book,  
HANDBOOK OF CATHOLIC SACRAMENTALS:

**2** The two turtle doves were the Old & New Testaments

**3** The three French hens stood for faith, hope, & love.

**4** The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John.

**5** The five golden rings rerepresented the first five books of the Old Testament, which describe man's fall into sin and the great love of God in sending a Savior.

**6** The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation

**7** Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit – Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

**8** The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

**9** Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit – Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience [Forbearance], Goodness [Kindness], Mildness, Fidelity, Modesty, Continency [Chastity].

**10** The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.

**11** The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful Apostles.

**12** The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in The Apostles' Creed.

**Marriage:** Couples who want to request the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector/pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the wedding. Weddings are not ordinarily celebrated during Lent.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Please call the parish office to make arrangements.
