## DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

How to Receive the Graces of the Feast of Divine Mercy: An abundance of Mercy is offered to those who:

1. Are merciful to others through deed, word and prayer.
2. Make a good and sincere confession during Lent (up to 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday).
3. Worthily receive Holy Communion on the Divine Mercy Feast Day (or Saturday vigil).
4. Venerate the Image of Divine Mercy.
5. Trust in God's Mercy.

Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened" (Diary #699). Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment" (Diary #699). He went on to say, "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy" (Diary #1109).

It is required of all Catholics to confess their sins at least once every year. If you haven't yet met this obligation, then take advantage of this outstanding opportunity to receive an outpouring of an ocean of graces that Jesus promises on this day. The Church allows for one to go to Confession up to 20 days before or after Divine Mercy Sunday. Those who have already confessed sins for Easter could make room for others that day. ## KNIGHTS OF ST. JOSEPH

The Knight's May prayer intention is that all individuals seriously reflect upon the last four things and at the time of their death, die a happy death, commonly known as dying in the state of Sanctifying Grace.

What are those last four things? They are namely death, judgment, heaven and hell.

Death is the separation of man's mortal body and immortal soul. It comes to all men as a result of original sin. It is a temporary state, for at the end of the world, all men shall rise again to be judged by Christ. Thus the whole man, body and soul, will be rewarded for the good or evil that he has done, body and soul, in this life.

At the moment of death, each human person is judged by God based on his conduct in this life, and goes immediately to his reward or punishment. Moreover, at the end of the world, Jesus Christ will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead. At that time, God's whole plan for the world shall be revealed, and his mercy and justice demonstrated.

Heaven is the eternal state of perfect happiness resulting from the face to face vision of God, which is the reward of those who have served Him in this life.

Hell is the eternal state of torment and despair which awaits those who, in this life, have freely rejected God and the happiness which He offers.

Before the end of the world, there will be an intermediate state called purgatory. There, those who are bound for heaven, but whose love for God is still marred by some imperfection, undergo a temporary period of purifying suffering. When this purification is complete, they are fit to enter God's presence and are admitted to the joys of heaven.

Men of all parishes are welcome to join the Knights of St. Joseph on Friday, May 10, at 6:00 pm, at St. James the Less Parish (1032 Caledonia Street) The Knights will pray the Angelus, Evening and Night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. ### SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

**Baptism:** Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. The baptism of infants at the Cathedral is ordinarily celebrated on Sundays at 12:00 noon. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

**Marriage:** Couples who want to request the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector/pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the wedding. Weddings are not ordinarily celebrated during Lent.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

**Visitation of the Sick:**

If you become homebound because of illness and would like to be visited, please call the Cathedral parish office.
