Finally Back Home

More than 77 years after he died in the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, Navy Seaman 1st Class George E. Naegle of La Crosse is coming home.

The funeral, burial and funeral home arrangements were made by Cathedral parishioner Mary Ann Lyden, who is Naegle's niece.

Funeral services for Naegle were at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, May 18 – which also was Armed Forces Day – at the Cathedral. Burial was in the St. Joseph Mausoleum in Catholic Cemetery along Losey Boulevard, the same cemetery where his parents, George W. and Anna Naegle, are buried.

"I am grateful that he is returning to La Crosse, and that he will have a funeral Mass and burial here after all these years," Lyden said. "I'm happy that he's finally going to be home, and I'm also happy for the sake of his parents and his sister," who had hoped that Naegle's remains might someday be found and returned to La Crosse. Naegle's sister, the late Louise Naegle Weimar, was Lyden's mother.

Last September, the U.S. Defense Department's POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced that Naegle's remains have been identified through DNA and other methods of analysis. It said that Naegle, who was 22 and stationed on the battleship USS Oklahoma when he died, was accounted for on August 27.

Naegle was a 1938 graduate of Central High School, where he was a star football player, according to a story in the December 22, 1941, La Crosse Tribune, which reported that he was still missing. He had enlisted in the Navy in January 1939.

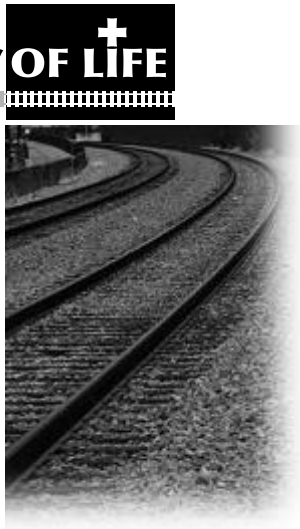
What to bring: casual clothes appropriate for Mass, clothing for recreation (basketball, baseball, etc.).

KNIGHTS OF ST. JOSEPH

The Knight's May prayer intention is that all individuals seriously reflect upon the last four things and at the time of their death, die a happy death, commonly known as dying in the state of Sanctifying Grace.

What are those last four things? They are namely death, judgment, heaven and hell.

Death is the separation of man's mortal body and immortal soul. It comes to all men as a result of original sin. It is a temporary state, for at the end of the world, all men shall rise again to be judged by Christ. Thus the whole man, body and soul, will be rewarded for the good or evil that he has done, body and soul, in this life.

At the moment of death, each human person is judged by God based on his conduct in this life, and goes immediately to his reward or punishment. Moreover, at the end of the world, Jesus Christ will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead. At that time, God's whole plan for the world shall be revealed, and His mercy and justice demonstrated.

Heaven is the eternal state of perfect happiness resulting from the face to face vision of God, which is the reward of those who have served Him in this life.

Hell is the eternal state of torment and despair which awaits those who, in this life, have freely rejected God and the happiness which He offers.

Before the end of the world, there will be an intermediate state called purgatory. There, those who are bound for heaven, but whose love for God is still marred by some imperfection, undergo a temporary period of purifying suffering. When this purification is complete, they are fit to enter God's presence and are admitted to the joys of heaven.

On the following second Fridays (June 14, July 12, and August 9) the Knights of St. Joseph will meet for Eucharistic Adoration at Blessed Sacrament Parish in the Adoration Chapel as many of our men will be on family vacations and family events throughout the summer. 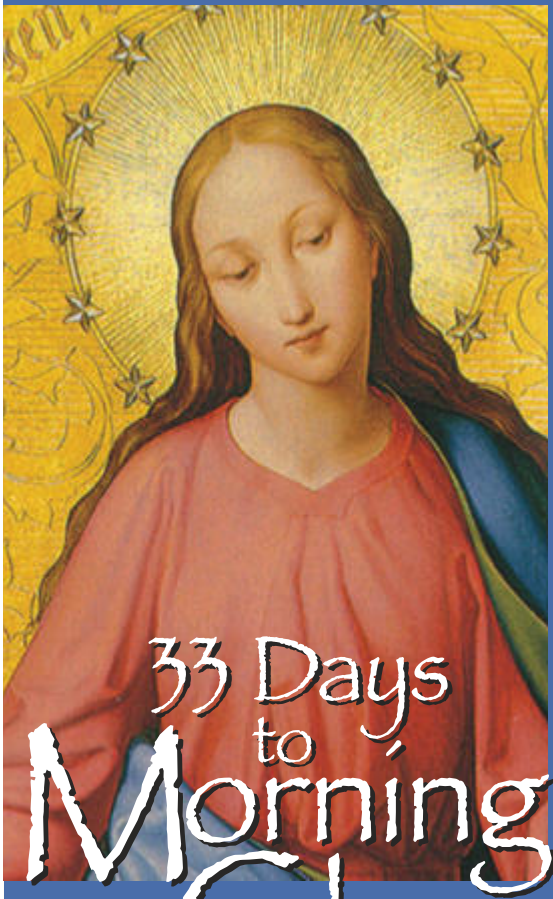

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Baptism: Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. The baptism of infants at the Cathedral is ordinarily celebrated on Sundays at 12:00 noon. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Marriage: Couples who want to request the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector/pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the wedding. Weddings are not ordinarily celebrated during Lent.

Anointing of the Sick: Those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Visitation of the Sick:

If you become homebound because of illness and would like to be visited, please call the Cathedral parish office.
