FORTHCOMING CHANGES

Dear parishioners and visitors of St. Joseph the Workman Cathedral. Msgr. Stoetzel prior to taking his new assignment alluded in one of his most recent columns that a company hired by the Cathedral sent a drone to take pictures of the steeple to see what is causing rain water to seep inside. Multiple places of concern have been identified and one of the first steps to ensure continued public safety is to erect a six foot fence around the plaza area and the northern portions of the east and west sides of the Cathedral Church. Phillip's Fencing has erected the fence, which will remain in place for approximately one year or longer until the repairs are completed. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience this may cause over the course of the next year or thereabouts.

Therefore, it will be necessary to permanently close the entrances to the Narthex until further notice. We kindly ask that all parishioners and guests use the entrances off the parking lot (west side of the Cathedral Church) and/or the Sixth Street entrances.

Another modification which has been made is the start time the Cathedral Church will be opened on weekdays. Going forward, the Cathedral Church will be opened at 6:00 am, Monday through Friday, prior to the 6:30 am Mass.

My name is Father Juan Pedro Roblez Baltazar and I am from Mexico. I am one of six children of Jose Roblez and Maria Luisa Baltazar Ramos. I grew up in a small town in the State of Jalisco.

My leaning toward church service began when I was three years old and asked to be an altar server. I was satisfied when I was told I would become one. Although, thinking back now, I then realized later that "they never said when." Only in my dreams was I an altar server, but I enjoyed it.

At the age of 14, when my pastor and parents drove me several hours to the seminary to begin my studies, I didn't realize that I would be left with 289 other priesthood hopefuls, who were total strangers to me.

"I need to return home", I said", I recalled, but I wasn't able to see my parents for six months, although my pastor visited every month.

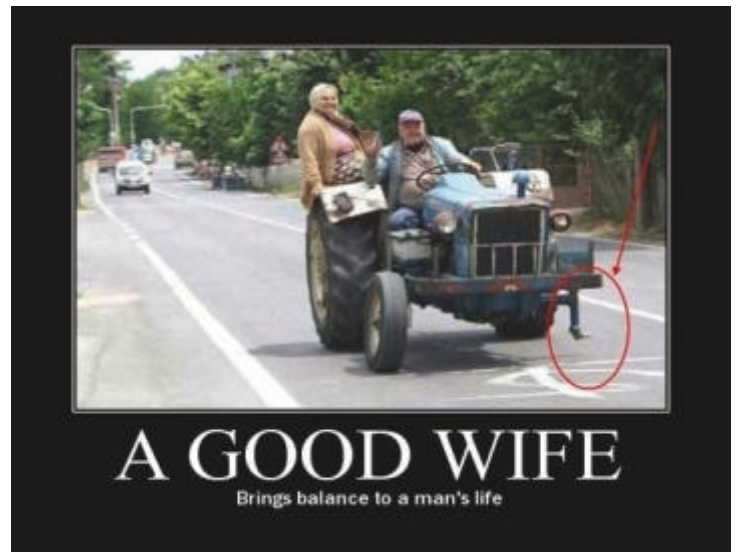
I completed 16 years of formation in the Archdiocese of Guadalajara. I came to the La Crosse Diocese on the recommendation of a seminary classmate in Mexico, prompting me to think, pray and ask.

I was conscious it would be hard for me, with a new culture and a new language. I have been a priest for two years and my first assignment was as an associate pastor of St. Patrick Parish in Sparta and St. John the Baptist Parish in Summit Ridge.

I am very happy here in La Crosse because the Diocese of La Crosse has given me the opportunity to study English and I will do my best. I believe and trust God that this opportunity to learn the language will be the right way to better serve his Diocese. Please pray for me and be sure I will pray for all of you.
