URGENT - Calling All Members of the Church to a Crusade of Prayer and Fasting

Dear Members and Friends,

We want to make you aware of the most recent, urgent communique from Cardinal Burke and Bishop Schneider, in which they issue a **warning against the six serious theological errors and heresies that are contained in the working document** for the upcoming Amazon Synod of Bishops.

They are calling all of the faithful laity, clergy and religious to a **Crusade of prayer and fasting to prevent the approval of these serious errors and heresies at this synod**, which is set to take place October 6-27, 2019, in Rome. For a 40 day period, from September 17th to October 26th, please pray at least one decade of the Holy Rosary daily and fast once a week for this vital cause. (Anyone who first learns about the Crusade after the date of its beginning can naturally join the Crusade at any point.)

Cardinal Burke has also asked the Marian Catechist Apostolate to publish a booklet on this "Crusade of Prayer and Fasting." Therefore, we are currently in the process and hope to have it available for distribution soon and with similar pricing as the last booklet. SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Baptism: Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. The baptism of infants at the Cathedral is ordinarily celebrated on Sundays at 12:00 noon. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Marriage: Couples who want to request the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector/pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. In the case of a mixed marriage, the non-Catholic party must arrange to receive instructions about the Catholic faith prior to the celebration of the wedding. Weddings are not ordinarily celebrated during Lent.
