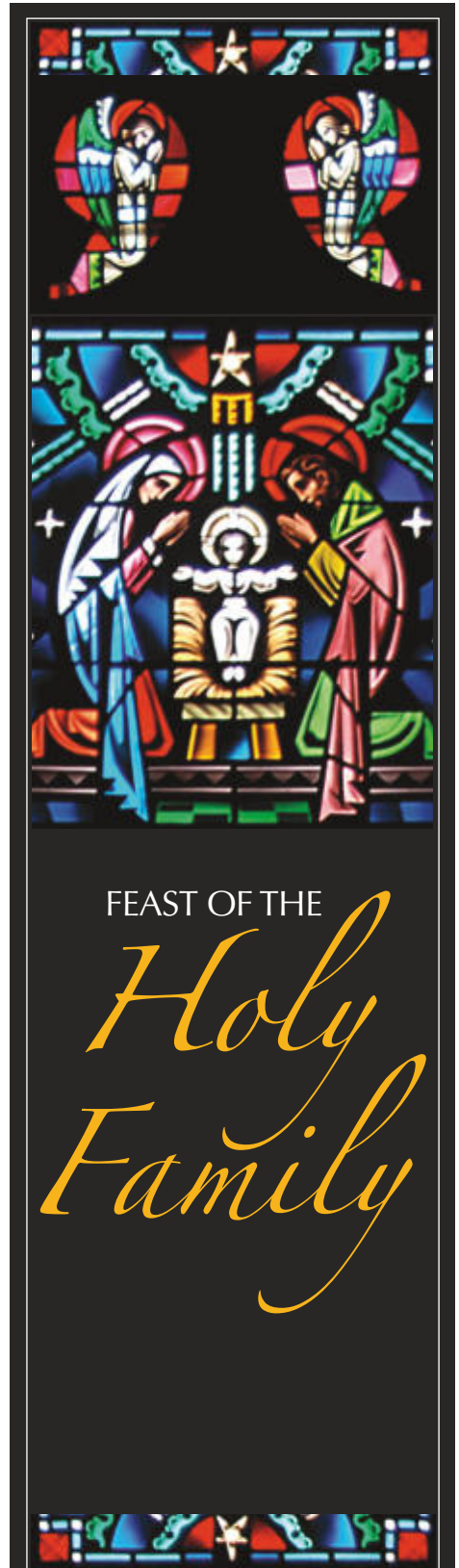
Eucharistic Devotions

Mark your calendars: The last week of 2020, we will deliver Meals on **Monday, December 28 - Sunday, January 3, 2021**, octave Week of Christmas (in part), and the Solemnity of the Holy Family, and Mary the Mother of God. These are especially powerful times of Grace, and our acts of Charity are more sacrificial because time is at a premium. Please prayerfully consider giving a lunch hour to deliver warm meals and smiles to our homebound neighbors during the holidays.

The Mobile Meals office has taken precautions to keep everyone safe during the pandemic. We are to wear masks, and a bottle of hand sanitizer is included with the clipboard and we are asked to sanitize before and after each delivery. The meals are picked up from the Market Street entrance of Mayo Health System at 10:50 am. The staff wears masks and will help load the meals into your car. Address and meal information is given in a clipboard with a map. The weekday deliveries are about 1 1/2 hours and weekends are about 30 minutes. Be Careful What You Dump Into the Lap of Another

What is the job of a family? What is its mission? Let's look at the Holy Family as an example. It is the role model for all families and sets the overall pattern of behavior. God wanted to put himself into our hands in the flesh, our flesh—that is to say, into our human experience. Thus, Mary conceives and encounters Jesus in a most privileged way. Upon conceiving the newly “enfleshed” God, the first thing she does is to bring him to others, Elizabeth and John. John, in the womb, is the first to be aware of the Lord's Presence. Having encountered the Lord, he is ecstatic and leapt for joy in his mother's womb. Then in response to John's encounter of the Lord, Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit. Now aware of Jesus before her in the womb of her cousin Mary, she cries out in a loud voice. Notice, loud, not soft and wimpy!

Especially as a family, we are to bring Jesus to others even as God put his Son into our hands. What do we bring to others? One major way this happens is by the use of our words, what we say to others. One time my uncle had said something to my mother about my choice of parking in her yard upon my return from India. A little skiff of snow was falling. My mother shared with me what he had said about me/my parking: not very helpful. Once a brother priest shared with me something another priest had told him about what he thought of me—nothing kind or complimentary at all. We are in control of what we say to others. Let's be careful about what we dump into the lap of others. With our words, we have a staggering amount of power. When someone shares something with us, we are forced to deal with it and this is particularly difficult when it is untrue, unkind and unneces-

sary. What am I supposed to do with it now? You have just given me something very ugly that I now possess and I do not know what to do with it. It takes a long time and a lot of energy to work through some of these things. All it does is to build up negativity, hurt and resentment. Of course social media and the internet can be a very hideous and evil way to force mean-spirited things onto others.

When we were kids we were taught to think before we speak; now this is especially true for big people in the age of the internet. So before we force ourselves into the hearts and souls of others we should ask ourselves three very important questions. Number one. Is this kind? Would I want to have this said to me? Would I feel good if someone said it to me? Number two. Is it true? Do you have all of the facts or just some of them conveniently, selectively chosen? Is there opinion mixed in with it? What actually are all of the facts? And finally number three—and this is the big one, is it necessary? Does it help build people up? Is this truly loving fraternal correction if needed? Is it truly for the recipient's good? Or is it really for the one speaking? Do you take joy in seeing others brought low? If it truly is for the one speaking (for whatever motive and it is not for the other person) then maybe that person could write it down in a journal or just have a conversation out loud with him/herself since after all it is only for that person.

The question is: what good do I hope to accomplish by telling someone this information or whatever it is I might say? Is it my place to do so? Understanding that there is one actual truth, it is okay for someone to have a different opinion from mine. Say something only once you understand that it is kind, true and necessary. God put his Son into Mary's hands and she in turn put Jesus' life giving goodness into the hands of others, most notably her husband Saint Joseph. This is what the Holy Family did. Might we do the same?

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Baptism: Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Marriage: Couples who want to request the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector/pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. Weddings are not ordinarily celebrated during Lent.

Cathedral Prayer Chain: Notice to all Cathedral Parishioners. The parish has a prayer chain that you may request prayer to be said and pray for the needs of others. Send your prayer requests to [Mari at https://cathedralsjworkman.org/prayer-request/](https://cathedralsjworkman.org/prayer-request/).

Wills & Estates: As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is vitally important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have an on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the “one visitor per day” rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or due to a post hospital stay and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with imminent preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. To the greatest extent possible one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are such severe visiting restrictions.
