MOBILE MEALS NEEDS CATHEDRAL VOLUNTEERS

Our Cathedral Parish is scheduled for Mobile Meals deliveries two weeks remaining in 2020. These are very busy weeks for many people and they can be hard to staff, so Cathedral volunteered. It's a leap of faith! Please Help! Mark your calendars: The last week of 2020, we will deliver Meals on **Monday, December 28 - Sunday, January 3, 2021**, octave Week of Christmas (in part), and the Solemnity of the Holy Family, and Mary the Mother of God. These are especially powerful times of Grace, and our acts of Charity are more sacrificial because time is at a premium. Please prayerfully consider giving a lunch hour to deliver warm meals and smiles to our homebound neighbors during the holidays.

The Mobile Meals office has taken precautions to keep everyone safe during the pandemic. We are to wear masks, and a bottle of hand sanitizer is included with the clipboard and we are asked to sanitize before and after each delivery. The meals are picked up from the Market Street entrance of Mayo Health System at 10:50 am. The staff wears masks and will help load the meals into your car. Address and meal information is given in a clipboard with a map. The weekday deliveries are about 1 1/2 hours and weekends are about 30 minutes. There is absolutely no long term commitment, so please help! It's easy and fun and an important way to serve our Lord in our neighbor. Time to "Joy Up"!

Last week on Gaudete Sunday (the "pink Sunday") we came to understand that we are commanded by God through the prophet Zephaniah to rejoice. If that was true for the Israelite community way back then before the time of Jesus then it is all the more true for us now! We have no choice but to rejoice—to have joy and to be joyful. So, let's "Joy Up"! And we are invited—and even demanded—to have this joy even when life is less than perfect because the joy that we are talking about here is not some mere emotional happiness or a warm fuzzy feeling in response to something pleasant before us. Rather, this Joy comes from the knowledge that

God is in our midst in a very personal and intimate way—especially through the Scriptures, Sacraments and His Church, all of which are "incarnations" of the Incarnation. Once we come to understand this through our intentional awareness that God walks among us and we among Him then life begins to take on a different hue. We are comforted by the Lord's Presence and know that the circumstances of life do not dictate whether or not we are joyful. I'm not downplaying life's difficulties. I've had my fair share, but couldn't one say God is "more near" in a particular way to those who are broken-hearted and thus a reaffirmation and summons

to find the good, to be joyfull??? God came into this world to be present among us in ways unimaginable. We are a part of that. When you do the will of God then both Father and Son make their dwelling within that soul. Therefore, the God within is the God-to-be-given. We are invited to be the Presence of God for others. As you can see, the Incarnation of the Son of God is intended to have ripple effects or even to be an ongoing atomic explosion of love because of what God has done for us. We have every reason to shout for joy as Zephaniah demands of us because what better gift could we en-

joy than to be saved from sin and eternal death?! It is not enough for us to know and experience this but it is our joyful privilege to make this known to all around us. As I wish all of you a Merry Christmas I have all of this very much in mind. In your own unique way, I have received the gift and the Presence of God through you! Thank you for being the presence of God for me and I pray I may always faithfully be so for you. May God's blessing descend abundantly upon you, your families and your homes in this Sacred Time of year. Merry Christmas to one and all!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Baptism: Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Marriage: Couples who want to request the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector/pastor at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. Weddings are not ordinarily celebrated during Lent.

Cathedral Prayer Chain: Notice to all Cathedral Parishioners. The parish has a prayer chain that you may request prayer to be said and pray for the needs of others. Send your prayer requests to Mari at <https://cathedralsjworkman.org/prayer-request/>.

Wills & Estates: As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is vitally important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have an on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the "one visitor per day" rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or due to a post hospital stay and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with imminent preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. To the greatest extent possible one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are such severe visiting restrictions.

There will be a 4:00 pm Mass, 6:30 pm Festive Prelude with Soprano, Oboe & Organ followed by 7:00 pm Mass (with Bishop Callahan). No Midnight Mass. Christmas Day Masses will be 8:30 am and 10:30 am (with Bishop Callahan).

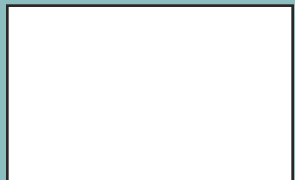
