The Altar: Prominence and Dominance!

Now we move from the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. We reach the culmination, the apex, the highest point of worship which can only be accessed through the hearing of the Word of God from the first part of the Mass. We have reached the Eucharistic Sacrifice wherein Christ offers Himself anew, re-presents His Sacrifice to the Father in our very midst. It is in the Eucharist the work of redemption is accomplished in each soul gathered in worship. What an incredible place to be! Every celebration of the Eucharist takes us to three places: the Upper Room on Holy Thursday night, Calvary on Good Friday, and to the empty tomb on Easter Sunday morning. It is a personal experience of the Paschal Mystery. Honestly, how could anyone stand being away from the source of Life?!

In this action of Christ's offering to the Father, we are invited—nay, demanded—to participate. It is a very real transaction. It's more real than if I gave you ten million dollars in exchange for the gift of your prayers. This transaction of the Eucharist is beyond price because we receive Jesus Himself: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. Jesus says we have life when we feed off of him. (It's almost graphic but that's the reality. You can say after Mass: "I fed on God to-

day." We receive the pledge and promise of immortality. There's no putting a price on that. Well, God already did that when He sent his Son to die on the altar of the cross on Calvary for each and every one of us.

The focal point of any Catholic church ought to be the altar of sacrifice (as opposed to an altar of reposition where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in the tabernacle). It is the axis upon which all things are "fitted together". It is the primary focal point of our Cathedral. Therefore, readily the altar ought to stand out with undoubted significance. It is the fulcrum of that sacred space and as such it ought to have dominance and prominence. The altar visually has to pull everything in this very large space **to it** and **into it**. It must have a "low center of gravity". With a new sanctuary crucifix suspended from the tester above the altar it will very much draw attention to it as being inseparable from Calvary's Sacrifice. Also, it will very much help to form that verticality we all search for when we worship the Father at Mass. We are gathered together in communal worship, yes, but the principal trajectory of each soul gathered is to have Communion with God from which flows communion with one another.

We will happily continue next week with what came to me as a visual image of spiritual worship when I was in the back pew doing my penance after confession. Do you remember what it was??? St. Joseph the Workman, Pray for us!

Couples must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the "one visitor per day" rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are such severe visiting restrictions.
