Jerusalem Comes to La Crosse with Wild Horses

Ok, I'm not tripping out...just trust me and read on!

Last week I mentioned doing my penance in the last pew and I contemplated in a visual way the nature of our spiritual worship at Mass. And, I imagined this "spiritual-prayer wave" rolling forward from the back of the Cathedral picking up steam, size and momentum with all of our prayers and sacrifices rushing upon the altar and landing onto it with the bread and wine—and then all of this is sanctified by the power of the Holy Spirit (both the bread/wine and our offerings), and consecrated into Our Lord's Body and Blood offered to the Father from the Altar of the Cross. These prayers and this "action" ascend to the Father in Heaven which is more strongly and visually seen and experienced by the faithful when incense (representative of our prayers) is used and as it ascends up into the tester symbolizing the courts of Heaven.

In this dynamic action, it must be asked: What explicit offering are you making to God in an act of worship at Mass? If you had to imagine/visualize your offering in your hands as a "real substance" what would it look like? How full are your cupped hands? When you transfer this gift into the hands of your guardian angel who carries it to the altar of God, what (for real) was "given over" to your constant companion? The Liturgy of the Word, the Word of God, has that role to "kick up" or stir into

flame or elicit a surge of the heart which yearns to make a gift. Truly, deeply hearing and drinking into one's soul the word of God through Sacred Scripture [here, you can already begin to "drink in Jesus"] ***is so incredibly important!***

Before our eyes, we are invited to see this vertical column: the altar, the candlesticks, the new sanctuary crucifix (forthcoming), the tester and then the vault of the ceiling. Jerusalem was considered the "naval" of the world—that meeting place, that life line connection between God and man. Jerusalem has moved to La Crosse, to the Cathedral. The one and only altar of Jerusalem where sacrifice was offered to God was destroyed in 70 a.d. That altar now in the new Dispensation (the New Covenant/Testament) is transferred to every altar where the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is celebrated. From the Altar of the Cross in our midst arises the very substance of our lives so that God can give to us in exchange the substance of His Life. This "transaction" is initiated in the Prayer over the Offerings. So, the priest says: *Pray brothers and sisters that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father. Then the people say: "May the Lord accept the Sacrifice at your hands ..."* It's that next prayer the priest says that I'm talking about (right before the Preface and the Holy, Holy). It is a most important, profound prayer. Really try to listen to it and drink it in. In a sense, it's the point at which you begin to "consummate the deal" (your covenant) with God where you give Him what you've got and He gives you in return Divine Medicine which promises immortality. Wow. I mean, who wouldn't want to go to Mass?! Wild horses couldn't keep me away! St. Joseph the Workman, pray for us!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. Couples must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Cathedral Prayer Chain

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the "one visitor per day" rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are such severe visiting restrictions.
