Really, We're All a Part of Team Hospitality

In lieu of my normal column, I want to share with you the May 12, 2021 minutes of the newly formed Hospitality Team. This work is for all of us and is crucial to all of us.

The purpose of Team Hospitality and Its Ministry: It is to connect people to one another through Encounter and Engagement. It's about building up our parish family by making people feel welcomed, embraced and loved as we walk the journey together. The focus is not only for all members in general but especially for new parishioners. We don't want the Cathedral to be the place where people can "get lost" and be anonymous.

Members: *Haley McMullen, Charlie Peters (chair), Tammy Weinberger, Betty Hayden-Tauscher, Pat Perlock, Zach Tudahl and Monsignor Gilles*

- Plan to do hospitality after the two Masses on the first Sunday of the month
- Have families sponsoring or serving the food and refreshments after Mass; they would also greet folks as they come in the doors to put a face with a name
- Reach out to businesses to see if we can get donations for food, coffee, juice, etc.
- Have families donate to the hospitality fund based on last name taking the alphabet and dividing it by the 12 months

of the year (ex: A - D will donate in January, E-G will donate in February, etc.). One thing to consider with this is that there may be a lot more last names in certain areas of the alphabet and almost none in others (such as X or Z).

- Create a directory
- Create a picture board of newly joined parishioners. To the greatest degree Monsignor tries to get a picture when he meets with new parishioners and these appear in the bulletin, but that is only for a week. The idea is to have it available for viewing for maybe a month. There could be a more descriptive in-depth caption for each new person/family.
- Post Mass times on the doors and/or around the Cathedral
- Create a sign that directs folks toward the church when they enter
- New Parishioners
- When new parishioners join, have them indicate what areas, if any, they are interested in getting involved in. Then, have someone from those areas or committees reach out to the new parishioner directly.
- Find out what Mass they usually attend and then have someone who regularly attends that Mass greet and welcome them. They could get a brief overview/tour of the Cathedral, and especially to introduce them to a few people, make connections and help get them involved in the Cathedral community. If you have any ideas as to how to increase our ministry of hospitality and outreach, let us know. The focus of this effort can also go beyond Sunday Mass and what happens within the walls as well.

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Cathedral Prayer Chain

Notice to all Cathedral Parishioners. The parish has a prayer chain that you may request prayer to be said and pray for the needs of others. Send your prayer requests to Mari at <https://cathedralsjworkman.org/prayer-request/>.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the "one visitor per day" rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are such severe visiting restrictions.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.


