Bishop Callahan has announced the lifting of the general dispensation from Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation, beginning the weekend of June 26-27, 2021. Only those who have reasonable cause for a continued absence from Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation shall continue to be dispensed. So that we might begin again to live more fully as the soul of our wounded world, it is necessary that we return to a regular reception of the sacraments, especially the Sunday Mass, the foundation of our lives as faithful and vibrant Catholics. It is with open arms and a grateful heart that we welcome you back to Cathedral Parish.

## DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. ## Jesus Wants to be in Our Nitty Gritty

Welcome back to the third part in the series of the Eucharist. We're talking about how the Eucharist is indispensable to the growth of the Kingdom of God—that little mustard seed becoming all but a tree! The Kingdom grows in a very real, earthy, organic sort of way. The Divinity of Jesus Christ intermingles among all of our humanity. The Flesh of Jesus is meant to sanctify the whole person. The prayers of the Mass always talk about our receiving the Eucharist as the way for God to take care of the whole person: body and spirit. Listen to the *Prayer Over the Offerings* from the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time: "O God, who in the offerings presented here provide for the twofold needs of human nature, nourishing us with food and renewing us with your Sacrament, grant, we pray, that the sustenance they provide may not fail us in body or in spirit. Through Christ our Lord." It's really quite phenomenal what the Lord wants to do for us. Jesus is not afraid of our humanity: as it was when He walked the Earth, so now too in the Eucharist. He's in the nitty

gritty of a person's totality—if we but let Him enter.

The Mass is the Paschal Mystery made available to us. It takes us three places: Holy Thursday's Upper Room at the Last Supper; Friday's Calvary; and Easter Sunday's empty tomb. The Mass "produces" the Crucified, Sacrificed and Offered One made present to us in the now Resurrected, Glorified Christ. It makes available and produces for us the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ. What is made available to us is the true Flesh of the Living God for our consumption. At the risk of sounding "casual", Enjoy your meal! Chew your food carefully—with respect for Him whom you consume—lest you eat and drink your own condemnation. Not only at the least should we be in a state of grace, but we should always ask if our disposition is proper and consonant with the One whom we receive. In other words, are we one with God and one with our neighbor?

The "handmaid" of Eucharist is the Sacrament of Penance. Use it liberally because the reception of the Eucharist all but demands it. The Eucharist and Penance together make up the one very effective "super highway" to Heaven! St. Joseph the Workman, pray for us!

## SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

### Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

### Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

### Cathedral Prayer Chain

Notice to all Cathedral Parishioners. The parish has a prayer chain that you may request prayer to be said and pray for the needs of others. Send your prayer requests to Mari at <https://cathedralsjworkman.org/prayer-request/>.

### Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the "one visitor per day" rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with pre-planned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are visiting restrictions.

### Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.
