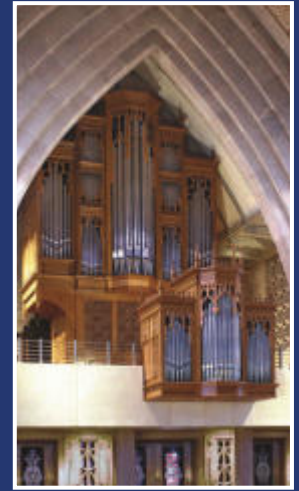

Bishop Callahan has announced the lifting of the general dispensation from Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation, beginning the weekend of June 26-27, 2021. Only those who have reasonable cause for a continued absence from Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation shall continue to be dispensed. So that we might begin again to live more fully as the soul of our wounded world, it is necessary that we return to a regular reception of the sacraments, especially the Sunday Mass, the foundation of our lives as faithful and vibrant Catholics. It is with open arms and a grateful heart that we welcome you back to Cathedral Parish.

**July 6: Some Personal Musings...**

You know how some dates just stick with you—that they have meaning and significance?...besides the obvious ones, of course. So, for example: July 6. [As of this writing, it is actually July 6.] That was my maternal grandparents' wedding anniversary. I've known and remembered that way back from my childhood—for some reason. Seventy-eight years ago in 1943 they married on this day. I see the pictures and wonder what their lives were like...how young they were; not knowing what life would bring to them; how they had to say "I do" to each other for 73 (I believe) years of married life before Grandma Kosakoski died. They were married right at the height of the Second World War when Adolph Hitler had his death machines ramped up to about full capacity. I visited Auschwitz three times. The experience is somewhat indescribable. It's hard to imagine what people endured there. Man's cruelty to man can be staggering and stunning. We have much for which we must pray.

So, back to Grandpa and Grandma Kosakoski. They married in July of '43 and along came my mom, Diann, a good solid nine months later on April 24, 1944. I think of people's choices: How they "chose" (or Divine Providence arranged???) to be married, giving birth to the first of eight children (two sons of which they both buried because they died in motorcycle accidents), then mom meeting my father Richard (Dick), and

getting married in November of 1962. Karen was born in December of 1963; Tom on April 24, 1965 (yes, mom had Tom on her 22nd birthday—she was at a wedding reception which was cut short because of Tom's arrival); I was born September 6, 1966; and Jill 11 months later on August 13, 1967. Four children in less than four years; then 12 years later LeAnn who is mentally challenged and cannot talk. Life was very hard for mom. She worked full time at the Northern Wisconsin Center for the Developmentally Disabled (AKA "the Colony"). I don't know how she did it. Mom was an incredibly strong woman but that only came about because life's circumstances called it out of her. We don't always get to choose what's dealt out to us. It's all about how we choose to respond. We don't always choose well and somehow God can even work with our messes to bring about good. We don't always choose well, but God calls us to keep trying and retrying over and over again. In the words of Pope Pius XII, who in his homily in 1950 for the canonization of St. Maria Goretti (feast day July 6) said: "Not all of us are expected to die a martyr's death, but we are all called to the pursuit of Christian virtue. This demands strength of character though it may not match that of this innocent girl. Still, a constant, persistent and relentless effort is asked of us right up to the moment of our death. This may be conceived as a slow steady martyrdom which Christ urged upon us..." Let's get busy and keep trying. You can't do this without confession of your sins. If you haven't gone lately, please do yourself a favor and meet the Merciful Christ there in that liberating Sacrament. St. Joseph the Workman, pray for us!

**SACRAMENTS & SERVICES****Marriage**

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

**Baptism**

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

**Cathedral Prayer Chain**

Notice to all Cathedral Parishioners. The parish has a prayer chain that you may request prayer to be said and pray for the needs of others. Send your prayer requests to Mari at <https://cathedralsjworkman.org/prayer-request/>.

**Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:**

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the "one visitor per day" rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with pre-planned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are visiting restrictions.

**Wills & Estates**

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

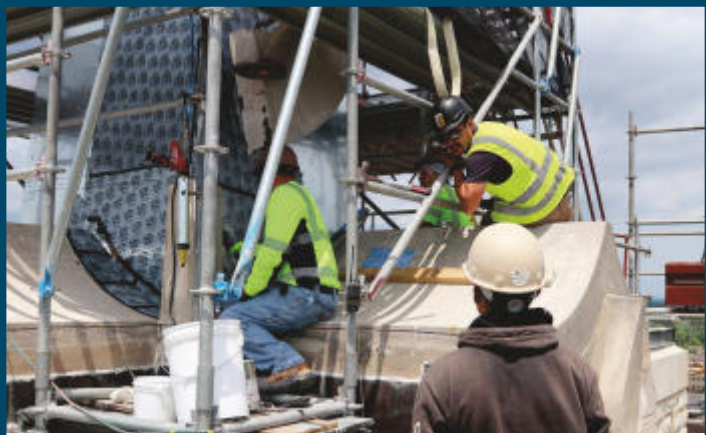

### EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

What We Carry from Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don't.

People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet.

Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust.

Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.
