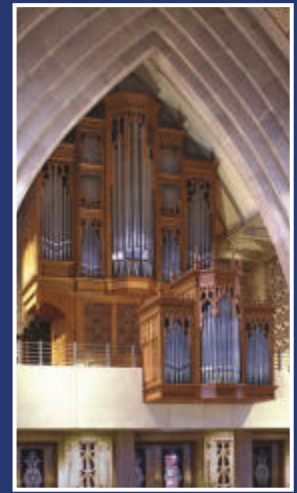

Yes, I am Preaching to the Choir—Amen!

Welcome back to the fourth and final part of the series on the Eucharist. We were talking about how we have to be one with our neighbor in order for us to be one with God. Jesus says that if you have something against your neighbor, leave your offering and go first to be reconciled with your neighbor. Then come back and make your offering. Another way to say it is: How can you love the God whom you cannot see when you don't love the neighbor you do see? This brings us right back to those three unities. How can the Kingdom of God grow if we're divided from God, His Church, or our neighbor? It is the Eucharist by which God has chosen to build His Kingdom—because it is Jesus Christ Himself! How can the Kingdom of Jesus grow without Him?!? Without the Eucharist, the Church would have died by.... when? 100 A.D.? If it were to have survived it would have morphed into something distorted and not the authentic Church. The Church had a hard

enough time staying on course as it was with all of those many rampant heresies in the early days. Without the Eucharist, the Church would have died; without the Eucharist to some devastating degree we will die. The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian Life: without it what does it really look like, then, to be a Christian???

People say: You're preaching to the choir. You darn right I am! That's the whole intent: to give you a message and method to go into the cracks and crevices of society where I can't go and bring to all the saving message of the Gospel. Those dark places need the Light that only Christ can give—through you!

What must our response be to this incredible gift? What must be my response to the Body of Christ given up for and given to me? This is called working out your salvation. Salvation is the response to Christ's objective act of Redemption. One excellent response is to pray the Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This powerful prayer ought to be in all of our spiritual arsenals. St. Joseph the Workman, Pray for us!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on call priest administer the sacraments. The on call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the maximum number of visitor's per day rule (Gundersen).

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are visiting restrictions.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Steward's Work Is Never Done

Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock! When you hear these strong words from the Old Testament, you're probably thinking, thank goodness I don't have any sheep — dodged that bullet. Nobody misled here! No flock scattered on my watch! However, we are all shepherds of a kind, called to tend our own sheep: our families, our parishes, our communities.

But it's exhausting. Don't we all sometimes just want to take a break from being a steward? The excuses are so familiar: we're tired, we've done enough, we've given all we can, what more does the parish (or my spouse, or my kids, or my boss, or my friends, or my community) want? We give ourselves permission to be selfish. So, what if the flock scatters just a little?

Jesus gets that. We can just imagine him weary with exhaustion, can't we? We see him on his boat, attempting to sneak away for a quick break — maybe just a chance to eat a bite of food in peace. He is God, but he was still human, after all. Even the most dedicated shepherds need to sleep. But people couldn't leave him alone. They were hungry for him. They needed what he could offer, and they needed it now.

As tough as it is, that's the example we are tasked with imitating. Everyday Stewardship demands accountability. It demands our showing up even when we are tired. It demands that we look at our lives, our time, our energies, our talents, our hearts, our bank accounts and think: where do I still have more to give?
