The Vertical Nature of the Worship of God in the Holy Mass: Part III

In my last column I was saying how having the crucifix suspended above the altar will visually lay out for us all the more readily this sense of a vertical “pipeline” (or umbilical cord) to Heaven. We stand together with the priest offering to God the Father the living sacrifice of His Son. Another thing that would further emphasize this even more is the Sacrifice of the Mass offered to God the Father *ad Orientem*, facing “liturgical East” – even though literally at the Cathedral the priest would be facing South with the people. We say “toward the East” no matter which direction the priest with the people are literally facing because the idea is that we are together facing toward the “Rising One” – in reference to Jesus rising from the grave on Easter Sunday morning. This is where we get the word “orient” from—the son rising in the East. For us liturgically, it is the Son rising in His Resurrection. In fact, churches in the first several generations of Christians were constructed literally toward the East (the priest facing with the people in the one, same direction) to underscore that the Mass is the Paschal Mystery re-presented in our very midst. Simply put, if I were to ask you: To Whom is the Sacrifice of the Mass being offered? Your response would correctly be: God the Father. And, what is being offered? The Crucified One—in “real time”.

My sense is that there is a certain “balancing” that is beginning to happen in the Church especially among a new generation who in a particular way are craving a deeper liturgical experience of God in a more highly articulated, ritualized experience of worship. They are tapping into the patrimony of the Church. They are not asking for anything which doesn’t already exist, and are beginning to express it in their desire to participate in Mass offered *ad Orientem*. They desire the focus to be more readily apparent that they with the priest are offering sacrifice to God the Father. Our body language and posture communicates important messages. When I offer the Mass *ad Orientem* and I ascend the steps once at the beginning of Mass and then again for the Liturgy of the Eucharist I practically get shivers down my spine because even in this sensorial way I understand more explicitly that I’m approaching Calvary with my people. It can be overwhelming, in a good sense.

The Church is organic, not an organization. It is a living body which grows and becomes what it is meant to be—it is Christ coming to full stature as St. Paul says. So, this ever evolving Church moves forward and we as individual members try to read the signs of the times and to stay “in step” with her. I know. This is not always easy. Change—no matter of what stripe—is never easy. This, then, demands from us an open-minded, thoughtful pondering of the reality before us. It invites us to become more generous and more liberal in our embracing all that the Church offers us. St. Joseph the Workman, Pray for us!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments. The on-call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the maximum number of visitors per day rule.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are visiting restrictions.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

for Catechumens, Candidates, Parishioners and Sponsors

What is R.C.I.A.?

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (R.C.I.A.) is the Catholic Church's way of inviting and initiating new members, while providing appropriate spiritual formation for them.

It is a process of prayer, study, discussion and liturgical celebration for:

Unbaptized adults who wish to learn about the faith to possibly enter the Church;

Baptized Christians from other faiths who want to learn more about the Catholic faith so they can possibly enter the Church;

Baptized Catholics who have *not* received the sacraments of Eucharist and/or Confirmation and who desire to complete their initiation into the Church.

Parishioners who desire to learn more about their own faith and to walk this journey in support with other participants.

What the Process Entails

“If I begin, am I obligated to become a Catholic?”

Absolutely not! But by participating, an individual must be aware that they will have an entire community praying for their generous discernment to answer Christ's call.

“What would be expected of me?”

R.C.I.A. is a journey of coming into relationship with Jesus. The journey begins with the Holy Spirit's first stirrings in our heart for a call to conversion. In R.C.I.A. we discover that Jesus gives us His Church in order to answer that call. The expectation is for an individual to exercise a willingness to pursue that call.

“How long does the process take?”

This depends on where an individual is in their relationship with Jesus when they begin the process. It finds its apex with the Easter Vigil each year. With a usual hard-start in mid-September, weekly meetings take place year-round, plus occasional breaks.

“I think I'd like to begin, but...”

Four Stages (Liturgical Components) of R.C.I.A.

R.C.I.A. involves four stages, each marked by liturgically celebrating the person's deepening desire to say “yes” to a Catholic relationship with Jesus. The stages are:

1. Inquiry

This stage is a time for inquiry and evangelization; it provides an opportunity to stir the beginnings of faith.

2. Catechumenate

This is an extended period for pastoral formation and guidance aimed at training participants in the Christian life; it includes a comprehensive catechesis on the truths of Catholic doctrine and moral life. It comes with reception of certain minor liturgical rites.

3. Purification and Enlightenment

Coinciding with Lent, this period consists more on interior reflection than on instruction. It is intended to enlighten the minds and hearts of participants with a deep knowledge of Christ the Savior.

4. Mystagogy

After fully being initiated into the Church, this period is a time for deepening the Christian experience, increasing spiritual growth, and entering more fully into the life and unity of the Parish community.

RCIA meeting time: Tuesdays, 5:00 to 6:30 p.m.

Weekly 1½ hour sessions cover a broad range of topics about the Catholic faith that encompass the entire spectrum of our lives. All topics relate to how our call to be in relationship with Jesus Christ

is fully answered only in His Church; about how that relationship begins, how it grows, and then how it brings us to be mature disciples of Jesus Christ.
