Series on Points of Catechesis for all things Eucharist: Two Things

Today we take up: “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.” My college roommate Brian (way back in the 1900s! – 1985 to be more precise) tried to argue that this excused him from going to confession—that it was a replacement for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is not. Even if one were to go confession right before Mass you could still say with all conviction “Lord, I am not...” That is to say, who are we that the Eternal God, Creator and Redeemer of the world should humble Himself the first time to become Incarnate of our flesh and then to become Incarnate again in the Eucharist to feed our flesh and soul?! Again, the overriding principle behind most, if not all, of these points I’m making in this series is to underscore the absolute awe and respect we must have for the Eucharist because we’re “handling” God Himself! Holy Fear is in order here! About going to confession, my thought is if you frequently receive Jesus in Communion it’s probably a good idea to go regularly to the Sacrament of Mercy and Healing in Confession. I mean, after a month, how much sin do you think “piles up”??? Enough, I’m sure.

Receiving Communion. I’ve distributed the Eucharist tens of thousands of times. From experience I have

a few helpful pointers. Let me first say it is by indult (basically perpetual permission) that we can now receive Communion in the hand. Thus, the norm really is to receive on the tongue as it has been the case for, what?, thousands of years??? First of all: Less is more. **The easiest way to do this is to place the tongue just beyond the lower lip with mouth slightly open with chin/face straight.** A chin lifted up makes it very difficult. I know these things can be by habit and making changes are difficult. Trust me, I’m not going to “grade you” on whether you do it one way or the other. I’m not keeping tabs. But, I do hope you take this to heart and make an effort to understand and put into practice some of these things. And, once again, the proper response to “The Body of Christ” is actually to say somewhat audibly “Amen.” Why would one not??? The minister is making a statement of Faith to which you are privileged to respond “Amen!” It seems to me it is proper piety to let your voice be heard. It is what Jesus’ Church is asking of all Communicants.

The other point about all of this is that receiving on the tongue vs. the hand (or standing vs. kneeling) is that whatever method you choose it should be done with true reverence in our hearts. So, this is not about judging others as being more or less holy than oneself or others or whatever.... This is about growing in holiness and focusing how far down the path *you* are. If one’s personal piety is something that divides the community, then we’re in trouble.

We’ll take up genuflecting the next time. St. Joseph the Workman, Pray for us!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments. The on-call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the maximum number of visitors per day rule.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are visiting restrictions.

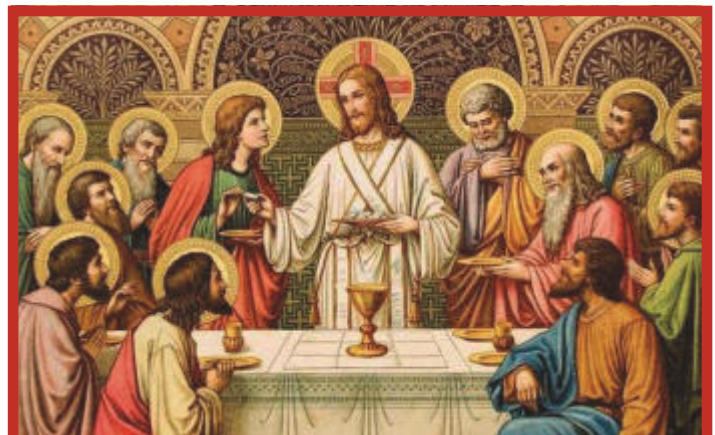
