## **Holy Week: A Time to Consider What God Has Done For Us!**

Palm Sunday marks the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, although it was not "triumphant" as that was commonly understood. Their vision was far too shortsighted. It went way beyond anyone's wildest imagination. I think the world is still trying to catch up to what Jesus accomplished for each and every one of us as individuals. In fact, each of us needs to assimilate into our own soul what God has done for us in His Son. What is our response to so great a gift? We must strive to grow in virtue, to grow in holiness. That means, when our sins are forgiven, we truly make every effort not to sin again. Will we fail? Probably. But, that doesn't mean we are excused from that necessary effort to "go and sin no more" as Jesus admonishes the sinner. As St. John Fisher remarks "All who have embarked on true contrition and penance for the sins they have committed, and are firmly resolved not to commit sins again for the future but to persevere constantly in that pursuit of virtues which they have now begun, all these become sharers in this holy and eternal sacrifice." The "holy and eternal sacrifice" is the work of redemption by Jesus: "Our high priest is Christ Jesus, our sacrifice is his precious

body which he immolated on the altar of the cross for the salvation of all men. The blood that was poured out for our redemption was not that of goats or calves (as in the old law) but that of the most innocent lamb, Christ Jesus our Savior. The temple in which our high priest offered sacrifice was not one made by hands but built by the power of God alone. For he shed his blood in the sight of the world, a temple fashioned by the hand of God alone. This temple however has two parts. The first is the earth, which we now inhabit. The second is as yet unknown to us mortals. Christ first offered sacrifice here on earth, when he underwent his most bitter death. Then, clothed in the new garment of immortality, with his own blood he entered into the holy of holies, that is, into heaven. There he also displayed before the throne of the heavenly Father that blood of immeasurable price which he had poured out seven times on behalf of all men subject to sin. This sacrifice is so pleasing and acceptable to God that as soon as he has seen it he must immediately have pity on us and extend clemency to all who are truly repentant. Moreover, it is eternal. It is offered not only each year...but also each day for our consolation..." (St. John Fisher). In this most sacred week of the year, take some time to contemplate prayerfully just what it is that Christ has done for you. And, then, live your life accordingly.

## **SACRAMENTS & SERVICES**

### **Marriage**

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

### **Baptism**

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

### **Wills & Estates**

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

### **Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:**

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay.
