O Mary Conceived without Sin, Pray for Us who Have Recourse to Thee

As you know, at the end of every homily, I end it with those words you just read. Sometimes I just presume most people know what I'm saying and what the response is; but, perhaps not. Either way, here's a bit of the history behind those words (Saint Joseph de Clairval Abbey newsletter dated August 24, 2013).

"On November 27, 1830, on Rue du Bac in Paris, in the novitiate of the Daughters of Charity of Saint Vincent de Paul, the community was praying in the chapel. A young novice, Sister Catherine Laboure, saw appear "an image of the Blessed Virgin, as she is ordinarily represented under the title of the Immaculate Conception, standing and extending Her arms...Rays of dazzling light beamed forth from her hands." At the same moment Sister Catherine heard: "These rays are the symbol of the graces that Mary obtains for mankind." Around the image, in golden letters

she read the invocation, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to Thee." Then this image was turned around, and on the back side, she saw the letter "M" surmounted by a small cross, and below, the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. After Sr. Catherine had registered all this, the voice told her: "have a medal struck after this model. Those who wear one that has been blessed and pray this short prayer with piety will enjoy a very special protection of the Mother of God." On June 30, 1831, 1,500 medals were struck, and initially were passed from hand to hand. Bit by bit, news of the extraordinary benefits that were granted spread, and people started calling the medal "miraculous." In 1834, distribution of the medals began to explode; as of 1839 10 million medals had been struck in France and abroad."

In this same image, you will notice that Mary's extended hands have some rings on her fingers with light shining from them and others which do not and are dark. This symbolizes all the graces that are refused when they are right there for the taking – or more properly, for the asking. So, with a living faith ask your Blessed Mother for the graces you need to follow Her Son and they will be granted to you!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay.

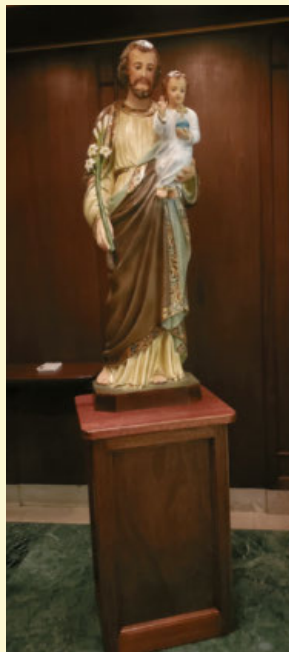
