
Eucharistic Devotions

MONSIGNOR'S Musings

Thank God for Purgatory!

I don't know if you've ever heard of the book Hungary Souls, but it is an incredibly fascinating look into the afterlife; and about how some souls are permitted to journey back into this life in order to request our prayers for them. These "guests" who enter our space and time, with God's "permission," beg not to be forgotten and plead with us for prayers in order that they might be purified from all which separates them from God. They are souls in purgatory.

This book poignantly underscores two things: 1) the absolute Holiness of God; 2) that absolutely no sin or effects of sin may enter into the presence of God. (This is nothing new.) It makes sense once you think about it. If we remember that God is all holy and not some casual "big guy upstairs" then we will be filled with one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit: Fear of the Lord. What is that? Simply, it's "awe" or the

deepest reverence for the Other. Another striking thought is this: to deny there is a purgatory is to forget the "Church Suffering" and to deny the existence of a critical part of the Body of Christ which extends beyond what we see here on this earth. The Body of Christ (the Church) also includes the saints fully within God's embrace with no stain of sin. Altogether we make up the Communion of Saints. Thus, we say we believe in purgatory every Sunday when we pray the Creed.

Some people find purgatory upsetting and I'm not sure why. I find it incredibly consoling. It is God's last ditch effort to extend His Mercy to us through our ongoing charity exercised toward them. This is the saving doctrine our mother the Church teaches us. In humility with gratitude, let us receive this important truth from Her. When I die, don't do me the disservice of presuming I'm totally with God. I beg for your prayers.

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay.




