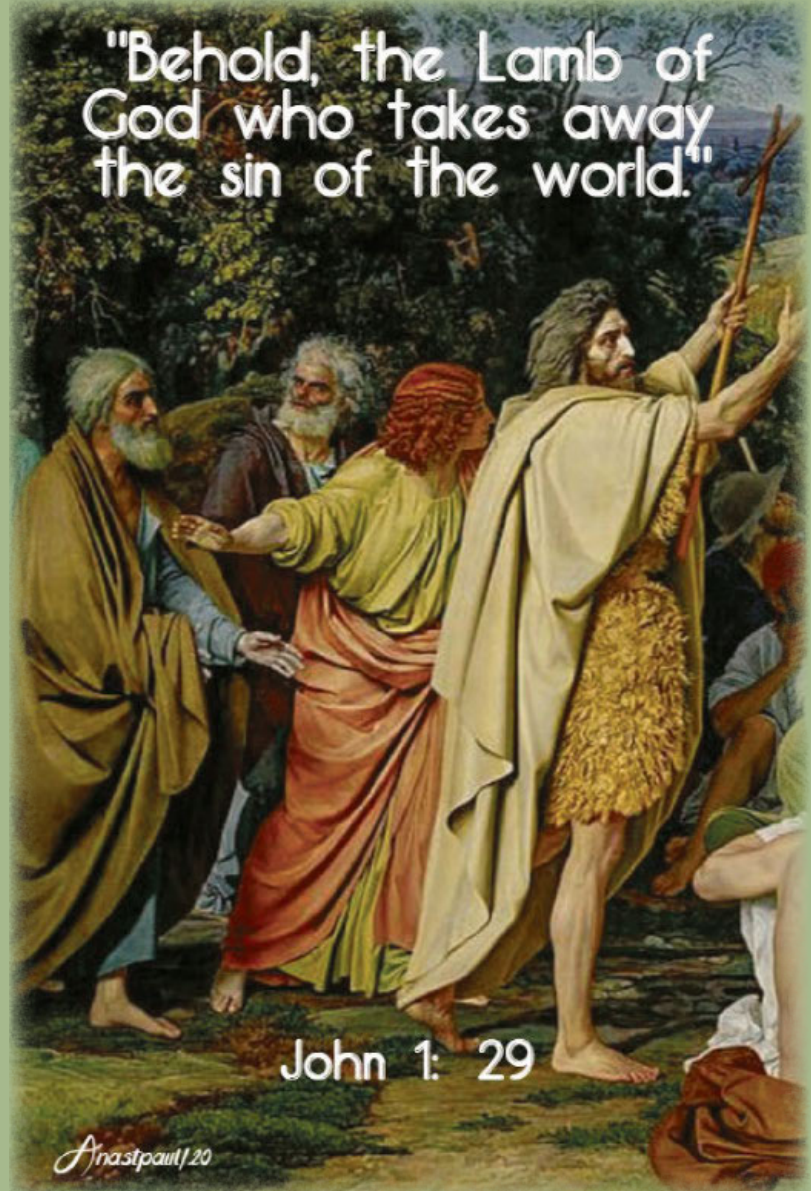
Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is held each Wednesday from 7 am - 7 pm including Benediction at noon and resuming after the 12:10 pm Mass.

## MONSIGNOR'S *Musings*



Most of you know Monsignor. Hundt who faithfully celebrates the 12:10 Mass Monday, Wednesday and Friday. I am so grateful to him for his help. He is well past the age of retirement but serves with the vigor and youth which comes from a life rich in discipleship. He is currently the Judicial Vicar who oversees the work of the Matrimonial Tribunal tasked with the responsibility of determining whether or not a declaration of nullity is possible for what is considered a marriage in the Church. A declaration of nullity is not "Catholic divorce" but it is an inquiry into a sacramental marriage existed "*ab initio*" – from the beginning. From whence does marriage arise? At the moment the groom and bride exchange vows saying "I do" in freedom, fidelity and fruitfulness to each other and all that the Good God has planned for them. Here are a few words from Monsignor Hundt regarding the work he does in the Tribunal. If his work is of importance to you, please take a look at the brochures in the pamphlet racks or contact him directly at the Diocese (608-788-7700).

Over the past several years, the number of petitions for annulment has gradually but definitely fallen off. Since I started in this office in 1984, the number of petitions has fallen from 300+ per year in the 80's and then into the 70's. I realize that the number of weddings has plummeted this past decade, and most people seeking an annulment are planning a wedding. But if people are not marrying in numbers such as in the past, the decreasing number of annulment petitions is understandable. I read just recently that 39% of men and women in our land between the age of 25 and 53 have never married and have no intention of marrying - scary stuff if that is correct.

Aside from the diminished enthusiasm for married life is the obvious fact that many divorced Catholics simply ignore a petition for a possible declaration of nullity when they enter a new civil union. I suppose the reasons are many, and possibly the most predominant is a simple disinterest in the faith of their baptism and the history of their family. But there is also ignorance of the process leading to a possible declaration of nullity plus fear of the process they don't understand, and maybe even things like cost in dollars and in time or the legitimacy of children or whatever.

## SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

### Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

### Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

### Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

### Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay.

## SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR JANUARY 15

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings provide clear and inspiring reminders of the most fundamental aspect of our identity — that of servants of our most high and holy God, His modern-day disciples, and stewards. John the Baptist recognized the holiness of Jesus and the response due to Him when he encountered Christ in person on the day they met at the Jordan River. His response, which we read in our Gospel passage from St. John, was, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world... He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.'" What a powerful description of our Lord and the place He should have in each of our lives. He is our Savior, the only one who can free us from sinfulness. We wholly and utterly depend on His power, love, and mercy. Therefore, He indeed does "rank ahead" of us; he deserves to be first, above all other priorities and plans in our lives. Let us examine our daily lives and encourage our children to do the same. Does the way I spend my time reflect that God comes first? Do prayer, weekly Mass, regular confession, and time with my family "rank ahead" of everything else on my calendar? Do I use my time, talent, and treasure to serve my family, parish, and community in gratitude? Do I recognize that God's kingdom ranks ahead of any other goals or ambitions? Do I use my time, talent, and treasure to glorify God? Challenge questions, to be sure. But questions worthy of our high calling as Christian stewards offered a glorious mission in service of our Lord and His kingdom. So what will our response be?
