Catholic Social Doctrine - Part II

Last time I wrote a bit of history about the beginnings of modern Catholic Social Doctrine. And I'll be doing more of that down the line. But today I want to look beyond the words in the title. I don't think I need to define Catholic, but Social and Doctrine are words worth considering. Social has to do with the society outside of ourselves and how we interact or deal with it. The smallest unit might be a family, with the largest being the human population of the world we live in. I like Wikipedia's definition: "Social organisms, including human(s), live collectively in interacting populations. This interaction is considered social whether they are aware of it or not, and whether the exchange is voluntary or not." Doctrine is where the teachings of the Church and the behavior of the members of the Body of Christ (that's us, by the way) comes together. Again, Wikipedia has a nice short and concise definition: "Doctrine is a codification of beliefs or a body of teachings or instructions, taught principles or positions, as the essence of teachings in a given branch of knowledge or in a belief system. The etymological Greek analogue is 'catechism'". It may sound technical, but it simply means that we have an obligation to do what the doctrine says is right. The earliest such religious codification that comes to mind that applies to us as Catholics is the Ten Commandments. We can talk about what the commandments mean until the end of time (and we probably will), but those 10 Commandments have not

changed over the last 3000 years. 1000 years after Moses, Jesus came along and where the 10 Commandments mostly told us what to do or not to do, Jesus told us how we are to BE. Look at the Sermon on the Mount, the Sermon on the Plain, the 25th Chapter of Matthew's Gospel – they all give direction/doctrine/dogma/codification on how we are to interact both with each other and with God. That is what Catholic social teaching is all about. I want to finish today with a true story, in which I was involved to help bring this point home. This happened when I was chaplain at the La Crosse County Jail. A socially upper-class woman was arrested for her second drunk driving. She was very much aware of her own social standing and did not feel that she should have to follow the directions of the court. She thought them "unreasonable". So predictably she ended up in front of the judge again. This time she was sentenced to community service, and the judge called me from court while court was in session and asked me to arrange her service. I set her up to assist on Thursday afternoons and evenings to serve and clean up at our local Catholic Worker House, A Place of Grace. So, for the next six months she was there every Thursday, cooking and serving food to people for many of whom Thursday was the one day of the week when they ate well – and cleaning up after them. Just before her time was up, she called me to thank me for arranging her community service. She was introduced to a whole segment of society (there's that word again) which she never in her life of comfort had ever had any kind of contact with. And she loved being of service, she said, real service, for the first time in her life. That is the first story, and the lesson is that sometimes we have to go away from where we are to a place where there is a need – and try to meet that need. A couple more stories next time, and then some more history.

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR JANUARY 22

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Gospel Reading for today is popularly called the Sermon on the Mount. Many think it is the absolute epitome of Jesus' teachings. To be sure, it tells us how we are to live our lives and the attitudes we are to have. However, we must remember that those who were waiting and hoping for the Messiah expected a military leader who would lead them in the battle against their oppressors. In His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gives a more accurate perspective of Who He is. He begins what we call the Beatitudes (the word means "blessings") with "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." In a sense, we are all "poor in spirit." Without the guidance and strength the Lord provides, there is no way we can escape this poverty of spirit, of spirituality, if you will. That is why we often say that living God-centered lives is at the very core of stewardship. Being a disciple of Christ translates into stewarding our many gifts and blessings. Some scholars believe that Jesus may have given this sermon often during His ministry. Those who followed Jesus and became the earliest Christians, the first members of the Church, were fond of quoting and referring to what the Lord said on this occasion. As stated, Jesus provides us with the secret of living a good life. If we rely on Him and follow Him, we will be blessed.
