The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. ## **SACRAMENTS & SERVICES**

### **Marriage**

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

### **Baptism**

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

### **Wills & Estates**

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

### **Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:**

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay.

## SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR APRIL 23

**Third Sunday of Easter** - Today's readings focus on the theme of "sojourning." As Christian stewards, we know our lives are a sojourn toward the ultimate destination of heaven. Our Gospel passage today describes the sojourn of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. The two are dejected and despondent after Jesus' death. They knew Jesus personally. They had heard the Gospel message directly from His lips. They listened to the testimony of the women who discovered the empty tomb of our Lord and saw a vision of angels announcing He was alive. They had been informed by other disciples who went to the tomb that all was as the women reported. How much more obvious could the Good News be? And yet, at times, the reaction of the two disciples describes our stewardship journey. We have the fullness of the Catholic faith, the power of the sacraments, and the support of our parish family. Yet, we often need to find our way. We need to see all the gifts we have been given. We lack trust in the perfect goodness and almighty power of God. But notice what happens to the two men when their eyes are opened; they recognize Jesus in the Eucharist — the "breaking of the bread." They are transformed! Their hearts are set on fire with love for the Lord and their faith. They recall that their hearts began "burning within" as the Lord explained the Scriptures. When we find we have lost our way, we can go to the same sources as the two disciples on the road to Emmaus — the Scriptures and the Eucharist. In this Easter season, resolve to feast deeply on these two sources of grace. They are the fuel that will propel us on our journey to heaven.

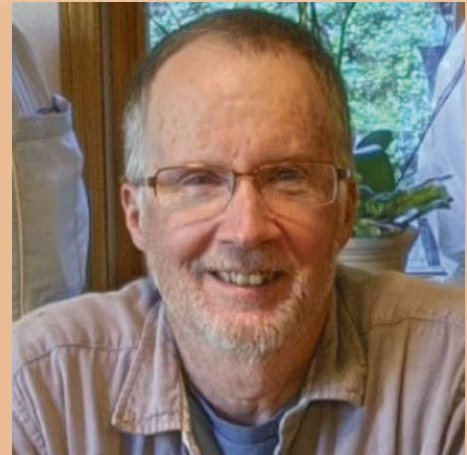

**THANK YOU BRIAN SULLIVAN**

There are 377 kneelers in the Cathedral Church which are over 60 years old. During the 2022-23 winter season, a project by Parishioner Brian Sullivan was initiated to repair damage to the kneelers. 143 new pads were built to replace the worn pads (of which 139 pads were installed and 4 spares were saved for future use). Wooden structures were repaired and refinished with a new center support design. In addition to the 139 kneelers that were reconditioned with new pads, approximately 25 additional kneelers were reconditioned and the existing pads were put back on the kneelers. Approximately three hours of labor was required per kneeler for this refurbishment process which ended up taking over 500 hours to complete. Thank you Brian! We will be forever grateful for you sharing your time and talents with the Cathedral on this huge project!
