The Gift of Knowledge

The Holy Spirit's gift of Knowledge enables the soul to evaluate created things at their true worth—that is, in their relationship to God. This gift points out the only true purpose of created things as instruments in the service of God. Guided by the light of Knowledge, we put first things first, and prize the friendship of God beyond all else. St. Ignatius of Loyola put it so well when he stated “All the things in this world are gifts of God, created for us, to be the means by which we can come to know him better, love him more surely and to serve him more faithfully.” Ultimately it means we understand the true worth of things in relationship to Eternity.

St. Teresa of Avila tells us that when we ask God for things we are incapable of asking for everything at once by a general, blanket prayer saying “God, give me what is best for me, whatever is good for me.” Between the Father and the Son it is sufficient because they were completely attuned to one another. That isn't so for us. We do not so

readily completely surrender our will to God the Father as did Jesus. Thus, when we pray we need to “take it apart” and ask for things separately so we can weigh it out. In a cut to the chase sort of way St. Teresa states that we “...need to mention each thing separately in order to stop and think whether it would be good for us, and otherwise not ask for it. You see, the gift our Lord intends for us may be by far the best, but if it is not what we wanted we are quite capable of flinging it back in his face. That is the kind of people we are; ready cash is the only wealth we understand.” It seems to me, the Saint is saying that we can easily go awry in our requests and sometimes just ask for those physical, temporal things we want without considering the true wealth of heaven. In all things, is it not true that God would always have the big picture in mind for us? That he wants us to have Eternal wealth and therefore will not give us “ready cash” on demand because He knows what is ultimately best for us? So, when we receive or not receive something it is only through surrender and the use of the gift of Knowledge that we come to understand and accept that God truly has our best interests at heart!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the parish office at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish for at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The RCIA is a process of initiation into the Catholic Church for those who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and desire to be baptized; those who from other Christian traditions seek full communion in the Catholic Church through Eucharist and Confirmation; or for those Catholics who have not received religious education, Confirmation or First Eucharist. This process enables one to come more fully into a relationship with Jesus Christ, to study the Gospels; learn Catholic doctrine and moral teaching; develop and deepen a life of prayer; and live their faith in action. It is not merely a course of instruction but a process of conversion designed to meet the unique and individual needs of the participants. For further guidance, contact the parish office at 608-782-0322, or Msgr. Gilles, Rector, or Deacon Joe Richards.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments.

If you become homebound due to illness, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill, should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR - AUGUST 13

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Stewardship spirituality invites us to surrender control of our lives to God in grateful recognition that all we have is a gift from Him. While today's readings remind us that, of course, God is always in control of His creation and His creatures, they illustrate what amazing things can happen when we fully permit God to take charge of our lives — in other words, what can happen when we embrace the stewardship way of life. When we take our eyes off God, we fail to see that all is a gift from Him, we lose trust in Him, and we do not make our lives a grateful response to Him. Peter makes this mistake in our Gospel passage from Matthew. Jesus sends the disciples in a boat ahead of Him to the other side of the shore. Later that evening, Jesus casually strolls up to the boat, walking on the sea. He invites Peter to join Him. As Peter begins to walk on the water, he momentarily takes his eyes off Jesus to notice the strong wind surrounding them. With that, he sinks. But what if Peter had not taken his eyes off Christ? He could have had a grand adventure walking on the sea with Jesus! When we take our eyes off Christ, the many blessings He has given us, and the loving way He treats us, we sink, too. But when we embrace the stewardship way of life, letting go of a tight hold over our money, time, and talents, our lives become a grand adventure, rooted firmly and gratefully in the God Who always cares for us.
