Christ the King: The Last Sunday in Ordinary Time

This weekend we celebrate the great Solemnity of Christ the King. It is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary doesn't mean "ordinary" in the sense of meaning plain or uneventful. Ordinary comes from the Latin word "ordo/ordinis" meaning "ordered" as in first, second, third and so on. It signifies that one thing is in relationship to the next in a proper, sequential way. These 34 weeks in an orderly way unfurl the great meaning of the two major liturgical seasons of the year: Advent/Christmas which begins next Sunday; and Lent/Easter which begins on February 14 with an early Easter date of March 31, 2024. What's laid out for us in those 34 weeks is "life in Christ", i.e., to live a gospel life based on the example

and the message of Jesus.

The Feast of Christ the King is the culmination of what we hope is the end result of having lived those 34 weeks in accordance with the heart and mind of Christ and His Church. We are on the pilgrim road with the ultimate desire that Jesus is King—and not ourselves. We are content to be good children of God hoping to hear those blessed words of Jesus at the end of the road: "Well done good and faithful servant. Enter into your Master's rest."

In all of this, time is of the essence. The liturgy at this time communicates a sense of urgency to "get this figured out" sooner rather than later for we do not know the day or the hour when He shall call us to Him. The art of dying well is the art of living well.

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the parish office at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish for at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The RCIA is a process of initiation into the Catholic Church for those who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and desire to be baptized; those who from other Christian traditions seek full communion in the Catholic Church through Eucharist and Confirmation; or for those Catholics who have not received religious education, Confirmation or First Eucharist. This process enables one to come more fully into a relationship with Jesus Christ. To do this we study the Gospels; learn Catholic doctrine and moral teaching; develop and deepen a life of prayer; and live the faith in action. It is not merely a course of instruction but a process of conversion designed to meet the unique and individual needs of the participants. Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the Rector to administer the Sacraments. Please call the Parish Office.

If you become homebound due to illness, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill, should receive the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR NOVEMBER 26

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Today, we come to the end of the liturgical year, celebrating the feast of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Our readings provide contrasting images of this King of ours-He has authority over all, yet He is humble and tender in His care for us, especially the most vulnerable. By offering Him our lives through the stewardship way of life, we can properly honor and love such a King; The Gospel passage from Matthew shows us how. The passage begins with Christ's description of His Second Coming, "When the Son of Man comes in his glory and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him." Then, the moment of judgment will come-some he will invite into the Kingdom of Heaven-for others eternal punishment. This judgment will be based not on how influential we became in society, how high we climbed the corporate ladder, or any "worldly" achievements. Instead, He will base our judgment on how we treat the least of those around us, whom Jesus calls His brothers. "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." To make His point very clear, Jesus gives specifics-feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, showing hospitality to the stranger, and caring for the ill and imprisoned. The more deeply we embrace this way of life, the more closely our priorities will align with His.
