MONSIGNOR'S *Musings*



What Are Some Elements of a Catholic Home?

Part one of a two-part series.

Last Sunday we celebrated the solemnity of the Holy Family within the Octave of Christmas. How fitting is it that this feast day is celebrated within the eight day Christmas event. I spoke about how the family is the domestic church and that it should look like and reflect the Church of Christ on the Universal, Local (Diocesan) and Parish level. So ideally the family takes its cue from the Church and at the same time is an expression of the Church. In other words when I see your family I should see the Church at least to some degree.

Looking at one's family you might ask yourself some clarifying questions. Is my home visibly, demonstrably Catholic? Is there a religious sentiment about it? Do you have artwork, iconography, statues, pictures, prayer space, a Bible or prayer books out and in use? Are you comfortable with discussing

God and religion in the home? Do we pray together? Do we desire above all things to help each other get to heaven? Do parents hold children accountable for observance of the moral law according to the Ten Commandments, including the practice of the Faith by attending Sunday Mass and keeping the Lord's Day Holy? As a family are we committed to our greater Parish family through service projects, volunteering and participation? As a parent do I speak positively about Christ's Church, His Body? Do I teach my children to love the Church and to have affection for her? Are the beatitudes lived within the home? Are the corporal and especially those Spiritual Works of Mercy practiced?

Thank you, all you moms and dads out there for doing incredibly important, sacred work. Your responsibility to raise your children to know Christ within your home is of critical importance to both society (the common public good) and to the Church. May St. Joseph intercede for you to raise up a holy family as did he.

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the parish office at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish for at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The RCIA is a process of initiation into the Catholic Church for those who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and desire to be baptized; those who from other Christian traditions seek full communion in the Catholic Church through Eucharist and Confirmation; or for those Catholics who have not received religious education, Confirmation or First Eucharist. This process enables one to come more fully into a relationship with Jesus Christ. To do this we study the Gospels; learn Catholic doctrine and moral teaching; develop and deepen a life of prayer; and live the faith in action. It is not merely a course of instruction but a process of conversion designed to meet the unique and individual needs of the participants. For further guidance, contact the parish office at 608-782-0322, or Msgr. Gilles, Rector, or Deacon Joe Richards.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the Rector to administer the Sacraments. Please call the Parish Office.

If you become homebound due to illness, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill, should receive the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR JANUARY 7

The Epiphany of Our Lord

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of our Lord. The Gospel account of the three magi traveling to meet Baby Jesus is one that we know well. Yet, when we pause to reflect on this moment when these men met Christ for the first time, we recognize that there is still much to be said for us today. When the magi entered the house, it said, "They saw the child with Mary, his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage." These men knew they were in their King's presence. They also came bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, symbolizing Christ's kingship, divinity, and humanity. Christ is still manifesting Himself to us today. We enter God's house weekly, and we are in His presence. When we meet Him, do we offer Him our gifts — our time, talent, and treasure? As Christian stewards, we must respond with love, reverence, and gratitude. To receive Christ's many manifestations, we need a grateful disposition to receive them, so let us prepare our hearts.

Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website.
