#### **CHRISM MASS**

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated on March 26th at 10:30 am at the Cathedral. The Chrism Mass is one of the Diocesan highlights at which the Bishop blesses the oils for the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism and the Anointing of the Sick, and consecrates the Sacred Chrism used in the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. #### **LENTEN REGULATIONS**

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent. FASTING is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 60. Those who are bound by this law may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Why Do We Veil Images of Our Lord and the Saints?

Good question. I'll answer it to the best of my ability. With regard to the crucifix, it is to prepare us for the great unveiling of the crucifix during the Good Friday Liturgy. The unveiling on Good Friday makes little sense if the dominant crucifix in the sanctuary is already unveiled. Moreover, with regard to the crucifix (and the statues) the Church's liturgy at this point in Lent seems to want to transport us back in time prior to the crucifixion. Before Jesus' death on the cross (and His Resurrection), there were no "saints" as of yet since the gates of heaven were still locked. To see no statues of saints is a reminder that the whole world waits anew with eager anticipation the saving event which sets us free from sin and brings

us into communion with God. The church building becomes more like a tomb—barren, craving new life, and culminating with Good Friday's stark, if not harsh, "emptiness." It is a certain "fasting" experienced in wood and stone calling us to do the same: to hunger for the things of God, to pine for our salvation. Seeing no statues is a reminder that there was a time historically speaking when humanity was "unsaved" since the act of Redemption had not yet occurred. Therefore, it brings to mind the startling reminder of the gift we do have and that it should never be taken for granted. It begs the question: How are we earnestly responding to the gift of salvation? It is a time pregnant with urgency.

## **SACRAMENTS & SERVICES**

#### Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the parish office at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish for at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

#### **RCIA** (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The RCIA is a process of initiation into the Catholic Church for those who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and desire to be baptized; those who from other Christian traditions seek full communion in the Catholic Church through Eucharist and Confirmation; or for those Catholics who have not received religious education, Confirmation or First Eucharist. This process enables one to come more fully into a relationship with Jesus Christ. To do this we study the Gospels; learn Catholic doctrine and moral teaching; develop and deepen a life of prayer; and live the faith in action. It is not merely a course of instruction but a process of conversion designed to meet the unique and individual needs of the participants. #### **Baptism**

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

#### **Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick**

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the Rector to administer the Sacraments. Please call the Parish Office.

If you become homebound due to illness, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill, should receive the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing.

#### SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR MARCH 17

**Fifth Sunday of Lent** As we near the end of our Lenten journey, our readings today remind us of the goodness that God has to offer us. In today's Gospel, Jesus announces that the "hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." All that He came to do on this earth was soon fulfilled. When we reflect on what Jesus says in this passage, He tells us a great deal about how we should live as disciples of Christ. He clearly states, "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." We must detach from our desires and entrust our lives to all God has in store. Without self-denial, we might miss occasions God has given us to produce good fruit. We have been practicing this throughout our Lenten season through fasting. One way to continue this effort after Lent is by taking advantage of the opportunities God presents to us to sacrifice our desires for something much more significant - whether waking earlier to spend time in prayer, fasting from a favorite comfort weekly, or taking the time to check in on a friend or family member instead of turning on the TV, to name a few. We must continue to make room for God and the good things He wants to produce in us all year long. As our Lenten journey soon concludes, may we consider how we might continue the practice of self-denial by offering small, daily sacrifices to the Lord.






