
Eucharistic Devotions

MONSIGNOR'S Musings

Putting Busyness in Its Proper Place: Happy Easter!

Many times people say something to the effect of "I know how busy you are" especially around the big feast days and certainly for the High Holy Days of the Paschal Triduum. Yes, fair enough. Indeed it is true. However, I certainly don't have the corner on the market of being busy. I've been reflecting on this question: What is the source of our busyness? For me, it's almost all things dealing with parish life—everything from the Sacraments to that dreaded construction. The only reason we have a parish is because Jesus Christ rose from the dead. It's easy to get stressed over all of the work we need to do - and Heaven knows I am a master at that! If we're busy just because we're busy, then that can lead to a lot frustration, unhappiness and even resentment. However, if I look upon its source (Jesus rising from the dead and giving us this incredible gift of the possibility of Eternal Life), then it puts busyness in its place, in its proper place. In that context, then I can appreciate more deeply "the why" behind everything going on. Instead of stressing out, I can see this connected in its origins to the glorious Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. I can be grateful for everything that comes my way—even matters dealing with financial things—and don't quote me on this—but even dealing with construction projects!! (It's practically a miracle I'm even saying that.) But, I think you get the picture. Let the Resurrection of Our Lord make sense out of your life. All of it. Especially the things that might seem to be the least connected to the spiritual world. His Resurrection must permeate all of creation, every fiber of our lives so that joyfully we can subjugate and surrender the gift of who we are in return to Him who first gave us the gift. Fittingly then, I wish you a most blessed joyful celebration of our Lord's Resurrection.

Happy Easter! He is Risen! Indeed He is truly Risen! Alleluia!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the parish office at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish for at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The RCIA is a process of initiation into the Catholic Church for those who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and desire to be baptized; those who from other Christian traditions seek full communion in the Catholic Church through Eucharist and Confirmation; or for those Catholics who have not received religious education, Confirmation or First Eucharist. This process enables one to come more fully into a relationship with Jesus Christ. To do this we study the Gospels; learn Catholic doctrine and moral teaching; develop and deepen a life of prayer; and live the faith in action. It is not merely a course of instruction but a process of conversion designed to meet the unique and individual needs of the participants. For further guidance, contact the parish office at 608-782-0322, or Msgr. Gilles, Rector, or Deacon Joe Richards.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the Rector to administer the Sacraments. Please call the Parish Office.

If you become homebound due to illness, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill, should receive the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTIONS FOR MARCH 31

Easter Sunday, The Resurrection of the Lord

Today, we celebrate the Resurrection of Christ! Our readings today reveal how we can live out the joy of Easter all year long in our day-to-day lives. Our Gospel portrays the third day after Jesus' death when Mary of Magdala visits Jesus' tomb. Once she saw the stone removed, she ran to tell Simon Peter, and John. They also ran to the tomb, and upon seeing, they believed. We can tell much about these disciples' relationship with Jesus because of how they responded to the news about Him — they "ran." Mary didn't see the empty tomb and thought, "Someone else will figure it out." Peter and John didn't hear the news and thought, "I will check on it later." They each responded with conviction as they "ran" for Jesus. We must ask ourselves, "Do I have a relationship with Christ to the point where I am running to Him daily?" The way these disciples responded is how we should respond to Christ. We must avoid complacency, and as intentional disciples, we must stop rationalizing our choices by telling ourselves that we will someday get around to putting God first. Every moment throughout our day is an opportunity to respond to God in gratitude, compassion, and eagerness. Although there will be moments when we do not "feel" like responding to Him, it matters the most in those moments when we faithfully respond regardless of how we feel. Let us celebrate this glorious day with prayer and feasting, for Christ is risen! And let us strive to carry this Easter joy with us all year long by how we respond to Christ daily. Happy Easter!


