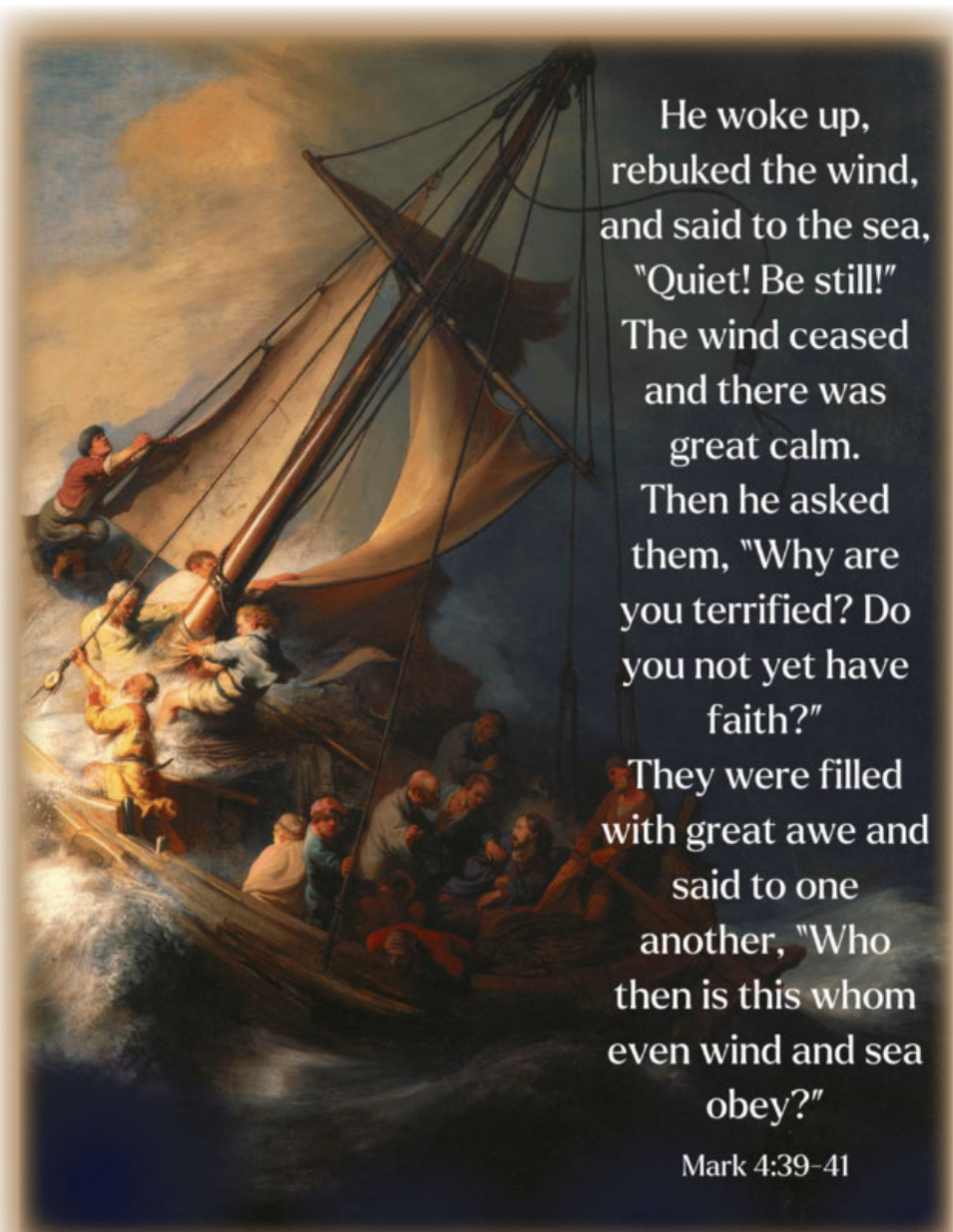

MONSIGNOR'S *Musings*



The Great Value of Confessing Your Sins Sacramentally

Each morning as the Church arises from sleep, she sings to the Lord in the words of Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist. In the dramatic unfolding of God's plan of salvation for us in the fullness of time, Elizabeth, wife of Zechariah, learns of her pregnancy. Zechariah doesn't believe. He is punished by a lack of speech until the time when he acknowledges God's plan by reaffirming his wife's announcement that the name of their son will be John per the instruction of the Archangel Gabriel.

When he finally "gets on board", the first words from the mouth of Zechariah after nine months of silence are: Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel... In this canticle of praise (LK 1: 68-79) he goes on to say that his son John will prepare the way for Jesus. He does so most expressly by giving the people whom he baptizes the knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. That really is the one "ticket" out of this mess: from darkness into light, from earthly life to that of eternal life. It's one thing to be a sinner but another not to know one's own sins. That's the really bad news—not admitting you are a sinner. Being a sinner is, shall we say, manageable. The way out

is the confessing of our sins. One wise priest to whom I was recently confessing my sins said: that's the good news in all of this—that even with all of our weaknesses after the Fall of Adam and Eve of which woundedness we have all received, God still trusts us. We can overcome; we can do the right thing with God's help!

The first step is the confessing of our sins. We are particularly blessed in the Church to have an effective sacramental means of removing sin beyond all doubt. Use the Sacrament well and often. What is the advantage of the Sacrament over other means of forgiveness? Is a penitent better off this way than "going it alone" and not using the priest in the Sacrament? Well, you be the judge.

1. First of all, one seeks forgiveness the way Christ intended it to be sought as taught in Scripture. 2. By confessing to a priest, one learns humility which can easily be avoided in private prayer. 3. You receive sacramental graces you can't get on your own. You receive forgiveness and graces. 4. We meet Jesus face to face in the Sacrament—for real. 5. One has an objective knowledge his/her sins are forgiven; one doesn't need to rely on subjective feelings. That can be tortuous! There is so much freedom this way. 6. Lastly, one can receive sound advice on how to avoid sins in the future. If you go it alone, one remains uninstructed.

I love using this Sacrament. After the Eucharist, it is one of the next greatest consolations I have in the spiritual life.

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the parish office at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish for at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The RCIA is a process of initiation into the Catholic Church for those who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and desire to be baptized; those who from other Christian traditions seek full communion in the Catholic Church through Eucharist and Confirmation; or for those Catholics who have not received religious education, Confirmation or First Eucharist. This process enables one to come more fully into a relationship with Jesus Christ. To do this we study the Gospels; learn Catholic doctrine and moral teaching; develop and deepen a life of prayer; and live the faith in action. It is not merely a course of instruction but a process of conversion designed to meet the unique and individual needs of the participants. For further guidance, contact the parish office at 608-782-0322, or Msgr. Gilles, Rector, or Deacon Joe Richards.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the Rector to administer the Sacraments. Please call the Parish Office.

If you become homebound due to illness, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill, should receive the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing.

Coat of Arms and Description

The great seal of the Diocese of La Crosse (left side of the shield) is on a field of silver. The three wavy bands at the bottom represent the three rivers flowing through the Diocese—the Mississippi, Wisconsin and Chippewa rivers. The cross of gold within the canoe symbolizes the travels of the early Jesuit missionaries through the Diocese and the faith they brought to the area. Below the left arm of the cross is a lacrosse racket, from the game played by Native Americans who first inhabited the territory. Below the right arm is a sheaf of wheat, indicating the predominantly rural nature of the Diocese and symbol of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The remainder of the shield is occupied by hills of green, representing the bluffs and hills. His Excellency, Gerard W. Battersby, (right side of the shield) has adopted a design reflecting his personal heritage, spirituality and ministry. At the top of the shield is a Celtic processional cross honoring Bishop Battersby's Irish heritage. It is shaped like a traditional cross but with a ring, representing the sun, around the intersection of the stem and arms and includes the three Sacred Hearts. The hearts represent the Holy Family and symbolize the unending and boundless love for us. The wounded heart signifies his devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and pays tribute to Sacred Heart Major Seminary where he prepared for the priesthood and served as vice-rector and dean of seminarian formation. The second heart, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, signifies the trust and confidence that Bishop Battersby has in the Blessed Mother's intercession and protection. The sword symbolizes the sorrows of Mary, the flames represent her burning love for Jesus and us, her children and the roses represent her purity. Bishop Battersby's devotion to St. Joseph is represented in the third of the Sacred Hearts, the Chaste Heart of Joseph, inflamed with love and adorned with the white lily of purity, a symbol of his faith and steadiness.



Monsignor Gilles recently blessed the garden statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe at the home of Joe Arbanas. Our Lady's image is placed in a beautiful devotional area where one can easily reflect on God's glory in the midst of His wondrous creation.



I am most grateful to the members of the PCCW who on the occasion of my 30th priesthood anniversary spearheaded an effort to present me with the gift of the statue of St. Francis, Secondary Patron of the Diocese of La Crosse. His image is a terrific addition to the rectory's courtyard. There were additional funds with which I purchased unique perennials--most of which I've never heard of before!
